Brian Comley on RAF Exercise Pitch Black 2022



Our member Brian gave us an enthusiastic report from his participation at the RAF exercise “Pitch Black”. The skies over the Top End were filled with aircraft from across the world for the return of Exercise Pitch Black.

17 nations participated alongside Australia during the exercise to enhance interoperability and develop strong relationships between participating military forces.

This year over 247 aircraft and 2800 personnel from Australia, Canada, France, Germany, Indonesia, India, Japan, Malaysia, Netherlands, New Zealand, Philippines, Republic of Korea, Singapore, Thailand, UAE, USA and UK took part with 9 different fighter aircraft types, such as the RAF F-35A, EA18 (Growler coms jammer) F22, MIG 27 & 29 etc. worth noting were the 6 Indian SU30s, a Russian design and 100% Indian made. The highlight for Brian was being passenger on one of the refuelling jumbo jets carrying 58,000gal. of fuel and the thrill in watching the refuelling of these fighters with 3,500gal. in 15sec. At times 4 fighter aircrafts flying next to the tanker, 2 connected to the refuelling pods with the second pair waiting to be connected, and all this flying at a speed of >600km/h. In his 23yrs in the RAF he has seen so many interesting things and enjoyed every minute of it, but sincerely hopes that peace prevails and nothing that was practised needs to be used in a conflict.
