COMMUNITY PAUL HARRIS FELLOWS



David Birss is a keen Golfer and a fitness fanatic. A casual comment to Rotarian Ian Faulkner one day on the Golf Course has led to the installation of fitness equipment along the Nelson Bay Foreshore.

In the early 80s David was diagnosed with high blood pressure and set on a course to improve his lifestyle including regular exercise. During a period when he lived in Switzerland he discovered "Vita Parcours" the term used for "exercise trail" – thus the inspiration for the Nelson Bay Exercise Trail.

David has been the driving force liaising between Council, Rotary, equipment suppliers, printers and local politicians. His contribution to the success of the Golf Day can only be described as outstanding. While not a Rotarian, his attention to detail in all aspects of the Golf Day, including the players, sponsors, and our Rotary Club was remarkable and ensured there was enough funds to complete the project.

Not quite completed, but with the end in sight the Nelson Bay Exercise Trail will provide health benefits to the local community for generations to come.

That in itself deserves recognition.

But there is another consideration. The Exercise Trail sets our town aside with a point if difference that will draw tourists to the town. So, there is a financial benefit as well. David we would like to thank you for your enthusiasm and

vision and recognise your efforts with this award.

Most people would know Max Pride due to his involvement with the Nelson Bay Golf Club. President from 2003, a dynamic leader he led the Club through many successful years before stepping down in 2011. In 2013 he returned as President a position he holds today.



We at Nelson Bay Rotary know Doug through his involvement with the Nelson Bay Australia Day Celebrations. Doug has lived in the Bay for more than twenty years and has been heavily involved in the local community during that time including a keen participator and promoter of the Port Stephens Yacht Club.

In 2005 he was named the RAAF Citizen of The Year awarded to RAAF personnel in recognition of those who dedicated their time to helping partners of RAAF Personnel. He has served for some 10 years on the committee and as chairman for 6 years.

But as I said we best know Doug through his involvement with the Australia Day Celebrations. Doug instigated the Billy Cart Darby which was incorporated into the Australia Day Celebrations of which he has also been involved for some 20 years – 10 of them as Chairman.

Through his efforts council were convinced to incorporate the Australia Day Celebrations into their budget and the event has grown exponentially since then.

Today, Australian Citizenship ceremony is incorporated into the celebrations.

Australia Day means different things to different people. It is a day to relax, to enjoy our own Australian way of life, to celebrate our achievements, to catch up with friends. But more than that it is a day that brings us together in a day of National Pride.

One of Rotary's aims is world Peace. Now it might seem a long bow to draw to suggest that our own Australia Day celebrations fall into that category. But when you think about it, it is the small things that added together contribute to the greater picture.



Through his and others efforts many charitable organisations have benefitted from events held at the course over the years including Rotary, Community Hospital Men of League to name a few. The fire of 2015 which saw the Clubhouse demolished led to many stressful days for Max, but his determination and drive resulted in successful negotiations which has seen the Club commence rebuilding with an expected completion date of June 2017. **Continued Page 3**

Gerry Mohan has been a director of Port Stephens Veterans and Citizens Aged Care Ltd. (Harbourside Haven) since around 2000 and took over as Chairman around 2008

Whilst always a successful enterprise, since taking on the Chairmanship, Harbourside Haven (A Not for Profit Company) has changed direction resulting in a much more co-operative and cohesive unit.

Staff and Board members are working harmoniously and the operation has expanded greatly under his leadership.

Working closer with Council and Governing Bodies the Company enjoys much improved relationships.

\$100,000 Returned for Community Projects

Community Services Director, Chris Bartlett gave members and our guests a brief overview of the Club's Community activities over the past two months.

Our Club have been extremely busy, resulting in over \$100,000 being given or allocated for Community Projects as follows

- \$35,000 to the Port Stephens Women In Crisis Group for their building project
- Payment of \$36,000 (Federal and Rotary Foundation Grant funds) for mechanical Gym equipment for Stage 2 of the Nelson Bay Rotary Fitness Trail
- \$25,000 (proceeds from the Charity Golf Day) allocated for the completion of the Fitness Trail
- \$4,500 to the Tomaree Special Ed School for playground equipment
- \$1800 to the Geoff Richardson Appeal through Richo's Rugby Day
- \$1,400 to Anna Bay Public School for the Years 3 to 6 Kids playground equipment
- \$1,000 to Nelson Bay Anglican Church Vanuatu School Supplies Project
- Nelson Bay Junior Rugby team's Vanuatu school/hospital supplies project
- \$250 to Safari (RPA fane) Kenyan School Education Project. TOTAL \$105.950
