CONNECTED LEARNING CENTRES COMING TO THE BAY SOON....





Another well attended meeting on Thursday night saw our guest speaker, well known local identidity and businesswomen Leah Anderson present a new learning concept to our Club members and guests. Leah ay Rotary Club, founded Porrt Stephens Women in Businesss and is the current Chairperson of the Tomaree Business Chamber, plus active in other community affairs. She introduced members to the concept of a TAFE Connected Learning Centres, which enables students both and old to be able to learn new skills interactively and remotely. And one is going to be constructed in Nelson Bay in 2020, an exciting opportunity, particularly for the many young people of the local community

Recent studies have shown over 70 % of students from Tomaree High and 30% from St Phillips High will not seek higher Tertiary Education; leaving a void in the local upskills area. Students can learn via interactive and practical methods and be assessed by the a highly skilled facilitator in another location. This training is further reinforced by a Mobile Training unit which will arrive at the Connected Learning Centre and physically assess the students work. Most students who choose this path need to go to Newcastle for further upskilling. The State Government through TAFE NSW have allocated \$7 million for this project which is due for completion by the end of 2020 in a location yet to be confirmed. It was a very professional presentation by Leah and I had included the link below.

A NEW HOME FOR NELSON


