Ruth Wilson: for the Love of Adventure



The speaker this week was Ruth Wilson on her love of adventure and extreme ballooning. Her fight to survive a marlin fishing accident in the waters near Byron Bay and that a pod of dolphins contributed to her rescue is the reason she is alive today. In NZ 1975 she found her destiny – hot air ballooning and became one of the early pioneers of hot air and gas (hydrogen) ballooning. She quickly established herself as a pioneer in this sport in Australia.

Since then, she achieved several firsts.

In 1976, she became the first female balloon pilot in Australia to establish her own commercial ballooning company. In 1979, she was crowned the first national female ballooning champion in Australia and won the championship again in 1982 and 1984.


In 1985 on a trip to Switzerland she encountered gas ballooning, this was not yet practiced in Australia at the time and became one of the few pilots in the world to master the art of gas ballooning. Ruth's love for extreme ballooning led her to compete in the prestigious Gordon Bennett Gas Balloon Race, considered the most challenging ballooning event globally.

In 1999, she represented her country as a pilot in that race, launching from Albuquerque, USA.

Her passion for ballooning continued, and in 2018, piloted her gas balloon, 'Bernadette,' in the Gordon Bennett Gas Balloon race from Bern, Switzerland, alongside her co-pilot, on a gruelling 33-hour journey, battling the elements and navigating the treacherous Alpine mountainous terrain. After enduring a sleepless night with limited food and water, they successfully landed their balloon in an Italian vineyard, demonstrating their exceptional skill and determination.

Her life story is an inspiration of resilience, courage, and unwavering passion for exploring the skies.

Beyond her accomplishments in ballooning, Ruth is an accomplished author and has shared her story through her memoir <u>"Conquering Clouds"</u>. *(click link)*


