CLUB WELFARE.

Rotary membership provides ordinary people an opportunity to do extraordinary things to make the World a better place. The five avenues of service Youth, Community, Vocational, International and the Rotary Foundation provide a framework for us to make a positive difference to the lives of many people.

From time to time our own members need support. Most commonly this is because of personal or family health issues. Often our remoteness from specialized medical assistance is a source of concern. We are very thankful of the kind thoughts and deeds of our fellow Rotarians. Our club welfare officer, Helen Ryan is always ready to co-ordinate help for our members. From time to time she will seek out others who can assist particularly with transport issues.

I also bring to your attention the availability of the local Community Transport Group. Transport to Newcastle, Maitland and other local facilities can be accessed for medical treatment by eligible citizens. Appointments need to be made to fit in with the Community Transport timetable and for a small cost you will be given home to service provider to home service. This includes a carer taking you to your appointment on arrival. Helen has information about the service. Our club has provided financial assistance and support to the Community Transport group and two Rotarians serve on their management committee.
