Darcy Geale from our sister club Salamander Bay Rotary was the guest speaker for the evening. Darcy very passionately presented the need for electrical power in remote areas and developing countries where the power supply is unreliable or non-existent. He has found a novel way to assist remote schools and medical centres in regions of Australia and Papua New Guinea. Their club has funded the development and purchase of three unique solar power cases developed in conjunction with an Australian company, Durst Industries. The cost of these prototypes is approx. \$1500.ea. With mass production of >100 units the price should come down to \$1000 -\$1200.- ea.

<u>Similar units</u> sourced from USA are on the market at US\$3500.

Each case with integrated solar panel was designed to act as a portable solar power base for remote communities and health centres. Often operations and even childbirth are done with torch or hand held lamps. This multi-purpose kit can also be used as a charging station for other portable equipment such as laptop computers, mobile phones etc.; in case of natural disasters it could be vital. With a battery reserve of 500Wh the unit will run two LED 5W globes for up to 50 hours without recharging. A variety of different lamps and connection cables form part of the kit with external PV (solar) panels an optional connection possibility.

Two cases are ready to be sent to PNG for field testing in remote health clinics, while one unit will remain with their club for demonstrations and showcasing.
Unfortunately, due to the COVID-19 pandemic the project is about 2 years behind schedule.
