Dr Emery Kertesz: History of Asbestos Mining



Speaker this week was Dr. Emery Kertesz. Emery is a hobby geologist and fossicker. His camping and outback travels always involves locations to pursue his interests.

During one of his trips in Western Australia/Pilbara region he passed through Wittenoom where the last Asbestos mining was carried out. This mining town had a very chequered history, from its beginning in 1943 until its closure and abandoning in 1966.

- 1915 Blue asbestos was discovered there and by 1923 could fetch up to £80 p/ton.
- 1939 Lang Hancock constructed an Asbestos Crushing plant that was sold to CSR in 1943 that continued mining and milling ops 'till 1966 when it closed due to profitability and drop in asbestos prices. CSR knew that asbestosis & cancer were the likely result of the conditions and despite many warnings from doctors & inspectors continued.
- 7000 was the workforce working in mining & milling operations from a population of 20,000.
- More than 2000 of workers and residents have since died from Asbestos related diseases.

<u>Mesothelioma</u> & other asbestos caused diseases were spreading rapidly amongst the former Wittenoom workers, a tragic development of the young fit and healthy workforce.

Just one breath of dust laced with the invisible fibres into someone's lungs triggers an aggressive incurable cancer.

That being the reason the government is about to wipe Wittenoom from the face of the earth.

One relocated former resident, Mario Hartman, still returns for a few months




Chef Navin Poon, born from humble beginnings in Nepal has become an internationally renowned Chef.
