A special mention to President Ann for identifying this opportunity, and great liaising with PS Council both prior to the event and on the night. The Club's profile was significantly enhanced. Also great to see how courteous the skateboarders were... a refreshing change.

Sunday at Bunnings proved extremely successful, the two teams kept busy for most of the day. Over \$1100 was taken, with a net result of over \$800 for the Club. A special mention to our young helpers Zac and Taylor Rimmer who did a great job on money collection and drinks during the morning shift. The two events have seen \$1000 added to the Club's coffers.

We had another Bunnings BBQ on Friday December 4 with a total of \$467 taken with a net total of \$350, and a prospective new Rotarian identified.

On Sunday December were raised **\$300** for a catering job,(cooking only)for the Port Stephens 100.9FM Xmas BBQ, (Cooking only). The money was returned to the Station to use for community donations. Again the club's profile was significantly enhanced.

This means a total of \$1650 has been raised from catering activities over 9 days.






Some photos from the Meeting:
