PRESIDENTS UPDATE

Our first meeting of the new decade was held at on Thursday night, with a small and enthusiastic number of members attending and welcomed by our hard working President Arja Levonpera, The fellowship enjoyed by members was good as was our meal. A number of announcement were made and are reported in this Bulletin, before Arja gave us an update for the last 4 weeks.

The Club has received a letter from Motor Neurone Research Institute thanking the Club for our donation of \$27,200 raised at the Judy Mitchell Memorial lunch held in November. The letter outlined how the money invested into Motor Neurone Disease research would be of great assistance as there is currently no known cure. Included in the letter was a note of thanks from the Executive Director Kathy Thomas congratulating the Club on their efforts in bringing hope to many MND patients. David Clark and his team did a fantastic job in organising this event, as previously acknowledged.

Arja reported Salamander Bay Rotary President, Gary Stanton had contacted her, with regards to working together if the Bushfires breakout in the local area.

The response to the District's request to provide short term accommodation for fire fighters was not strong, however members can advise the District coordinator if they wish to participate

MHERV VAN TO VISIT NELSON BAY

District 9670's MHERV Van will be visiting Nelson Bay in March this year, following our Board approving the visit. MHERV (Men's Health Education Rural Van). Admin Director Liz friend will coordinate the visit. The Van has successfully visited Dungog and Raymond Terrace in recent months and will give local men the opportunity to have free health checks. The other visits have been very successful. District coordinator Adrian Payne sent the following information by Director Liz.

We would like to offer your club an opportunity to host the MHERV van in Nelson Bay on the 28th and 29th of March. Apart from providing a great service by giving local blokes a free check up, it also offers your club a great opportunity to wave the Rotary flag (see the attached schedule). The project has at 7th of December probably saved 262 lives. We know this because they were the ones who didn't know they had dangerously high blood pressure and were lucky they hadn't already suffered a serious heart attack. High blood pressure doesn't have any apparent symptoms!

I have attached a fair bit of information, but it isn't a huge job to be a host club, in a few places just one person has done all that's necessary, although many hands

SHELTERBOX AND THE BUSHFIRES

Shelterbox Australia have been asked by many Rotary Clubs, with regards to providing Shelterboxes to bushfire victims. Shelterbox International cannot operate in any country in the world unless asked by the Government of that country. Below is an extract from an email from Shelterbox to their volunteers, received earlier in the week.

Hi everyone, I'm hoping anyone near to fires is keeping safe. I've been on to HQ in the last few days to find out if there was an updated response from ShelterBox regarding the bushfire situation in Australia. Although we are in a state of emergency in some areas, the Australian government has not called for international assistance and this is one of the main criteria in our decision to respond. Here's a bit more info from HQ below and I can assure they are watching the situation closely.

ShelterBox looked at responding in December and at that point decided a response wouldn't be appropriate due to the following factors:

- the extensive national response
- the context and high temperatures which would make our aid items particularly unsuitable
- the lack of request for international humanitarian assistance

The above has not changed despite the state of emergency in NSW, so it is unlikely that we would respond at this point in time, however we will continue to carefully monitor and understand whether there may be a place for ShelterBox aid.

Her various flying hats have included: Charter work, Shark Surveys, Firefighting, Flood Relief, Police Work, and Search and Rescue, as well as flying solo all around Australia delivering multiple helicopters to all sorts of weird and wonderful locations.

The most captivating time was when she was the senior pilot for a large helicopter company, up the top end of Australia. She refers to the vast, untouched landscape of Western Australia's Kimberley Region as 'quite literally a step back in time'.

Experiencing the most sensational parts of remote Australia through the freedom of weightless flight inspired her to write and publish two books of poetry: 'BLISS' and 'BLISS 2'. Both books probe and explore the power held within stillness.



TOWN CLOCK/INFORMATION BOARD WRAP UP

A club milestone was reached on Wednesday afternoon, when the Nelson Bay Rotary Town Clock/Information Board was officially unveiled by Port Stephens Mayor Ryan Palmer.

The dedication was organised at short notice by Council, with a small enthusiastic group present to watch Mayor Ryan Palmer and Club President Arja officially unveil the Rotary Clock, after a project lasting seven years.

Among those present were representatives from Probus, Legacy, Nelson Bay Beautification Committee, the Chamber of Commerce and previous Club Presidents, Peter Clough, Chris Bartlett, Ann Evans, Kathy Rimmer and Arja Leveonpera. Special guests were Bart Richardson's granddaughter Louise Ross and his great granddaughter Avanhna (3 years old and his great grandson Harrison 8 weeks old) and Louise's partner.

Port Stephens Council issued a press release last Thursday and included below is an extract from that media release

"The Rotary Club of Nelson Bay commenced negotiations with Port Stephens Council in 2012 after a suggestion from long serving Rotarian Bart Richardson, that Nelson Bay should have a town clock.

Several locations and various designs were discussed over the ensuing years, while funds were raised by Nelson Bay Rotary for this project, culminating in the current information board and digital clock being installed. Long serving member Richard Turner has liaised with Council over the past two years to ensure the completion of the Information Board and Clock.

2019/20 Nelson Bay Rotary Club President Arja Levonpera said it is great to see the completion of the Town Clock project. She said it was another example with Nelson Bay Rotary and the Port Stephens Council working together to provide the Community and the many visitors to Nelson Bay with a wonderful information source. Ms Levonpera stated that while the Information Board was dedicated to Bart Richardson, who sadly passed away 3 years ago, she added the commitment to our local community by all those who have been members of Nelson Bay Rotary Club in the past 63 years is also recognised by this project.

There a few minor touches to be added to the Clock, however we are confident that Richard Turner will ensure these will happen. Thank you to those members who were able to attend at short notice, as a Project Neighbour was being held on the same afternoon. **NOTE** This article was going to be published in the last Bulletin,(2019) however a technical glitch occurred.
