

Bulletin 24 of 8th of December

Annual General Meeting 2022

The club had its AGM tonight after our general meeting was concluded.

The New Bylaws and Constitution from Rotary International must be adopted by clubs soon, but as there has been insufficient time provided to allow all members to review them, we will do this in the New Year.

The features to remember here are that The Constitution as provided by RI does not allow changes to be made. The By- Laws are adaptable to individuals club circumstances such as meeting arrangements etc.

The minutes of the AGM held on 16th of December 2021 were circulated to members prior to meeting. These minutes were accepted by the quorum as a true record of the meeting.

The Financial report was presented by Treasurer Geoff Diemar. The statements of the two accounts of the club were presented, and were accepted by the membership. Geoff also provided an audited report of the Centennial Scholarship from Morley accountants.

The meeting then went into discussion regarding the cost of auditing our books in future, and the use of online software system Xero. The club is only small now and the audited costs at a reduced rate still costs \$1500. The Xero system costs \$700 per annum. The Treasurer with board support has discontinued the use of Xero and is using a spread sheet system which the accountant will accept. The turnover of the Club is low enough that it can have a 5 year audit rather than annual. It was also put to the vote as to whether we discontinue the auditor this year. This motion was adopted by majority. At the moment we effectively pay \$100 a head annually for our current financial methods. The auditing costs likely will rise substantially in the next few years. Perhaps some checking of the books can be made each year by an independent source without full auditing? Board can review this item.






The Back Page
