NELSON BAY ROTARY AND BUNNINGS

Following the recent 'Oniongate' issue at Bunnings, there have been several discussions with Bunnings management at Taylors Beach re the configuration of the BBQ and work area. We have fielded comments from a some members about these issues. A number of other community groups have made representations to Bunnings management. Nelson Bay Rotary Club's Board has reviewed the situation and a summary of the discussion is listed below

- 1 That our Club has worked long and hard for over a decade to build a relationship with Bunnings, and despite some current differences of views regarding the layout of the BBQ, and the Board wish to continue the current relationship.
- 2 That the Community Service Director and the Board continue discussions with the local Bunnings management team to resolve the concerns re layout and other possible Bunnings issues.
- 3. While the current arrangement is not ideal, the Board feel with positive discussions the issues will be resolved to both parties satisfaction
- 4. The revenue stream from Bunnings this year will be close to \$12,000, revenue we do not wish to lose.
- 5. Member participation at Bunnings this year has been very strong, with all but a few members participating in some way.
- 6. Bunnings have been generous to our Club supplying extra dates, and their family nights (4) which have been profitable to the Club, in both dollars and the supplying of surplus stock which we make a 100 per cent profit. They were generous in supplying vouchers which we used as Golf Day prizes and supplied \$500 worth of plants and trees for our tree planting project at Anna Bay School last Rotary year..

The Board trusts this clarifies the Club's position with Bunnings
