Driving across the Sydney Harbour bridge there is significantly more steel beams than would be required in a new bridge with modern materials and the construction would be quite different, possibly composite steel and concrete.

In our local Bunnings the ceiling shows a certain of construction which does not bear a lot of weight and would not be strong enough in a country with snowfall. Solar panels are to be installed on the roof hence the work going on there at the moment.

The ships which enter Newcastle harbour must be loaded in the correct way otherwise the potential is there for distortion of the hull. They also do not handle running aground and tend to break up easily.
