A few days ago I was having a pretty bad day so a friend of mine suggested we have a drive to Tanilba Bay to find the secret garden.

The secret garden is a community project by a group of residents at Tanilba

All the houses in a particular street have houses that back onto a reserve owned by Port Stepher Council and a few years ago they asked if they could create a garden on the land and this is the result.

You walk down a pathway to the reserve and this is what you find. These photos don't really do it justice as the area is quite large and you can't see the scale from this collage, but it is so pretty it there.
