## **Guest Speaker: Mel Turner**

This weeks guest speaker was Mel Turner president of Business Port Stephens. Mel has a close connection to our Rotary club as she is the eldest daughter of members Richard and Jenny Turner. Mel has previously held senior positions with the Peppers Group and more recently Moonshadow TCQ cruises and is now the marketing manager of Destination Port Stephens. Mel has a deep understanding of tourism and the local area, she is also a vibrant and energetic speaker.

Business Port Stephens is a not for profit group operating with the purpose to promote, encourage and support local business across the Port Stephens LGA. It works closely with its members and council to improve business opportunities. To achieve this the LGA is divided into 8 precincts each with its own committee that reports back to the chamber. It is likely that in the near future two more precincts will be added for Medowie and Karuah with both of these areas needing improved services to cope with their rapid population expansion.

Business Port Stephens provides a number of networking opportunities for its members to connect, discuss issues and find ways of working together. This also gives an opportunity for members to have a real say in Port Stephens with Business Port Stephens acting as a voice for the common interests of local business. Business Port Stephens can then advocate on members' behalf through established relationships with Local, State and Federal Government stakeholders.

During Covid lockdowns tourism was down 70-80%, and many of our local tourism businesses are still struggling to adapt and survive. Research shows the flow on affect has an impact on many other local businesses as each dollar spent by a tourist circulates 5.5 times through the local economy.

The other hot topic of Mels' speech was the extension to Williamtown airport runway. It is hoped that once this is completed an international airline can be attracted to provide services to bring international tourists directly into Port Stephens and the Hunter Valley region. For this to happen a number of LGA's will need to collaborate to upgrade services in and around the airport.
