ROTARY DISTRICT 9670 CONFERENCE.

During the past weekend 23 Nelson Bay Rotarians and Partners joined 315 of their District colleagues to attend the annual conference at Forster. The conference was one of the best held in recent years. Outstanding speakers presented informative, inspirational and enjoyable presentations which were enthusiastically acknowledged by the appreciative audience. Proceedings were guided by two outstanding young master's of ceremony. The announcement by DG Brian Coffey that all presenters had provided their service free of charge to Rotary was applauded enthusiastically.

The district conference is the highlight of the Rotary year in all Rotary Districts and it is disappointing that only approximately 200 Rotarians out of the 1100 in our district were able to attend. Past RI Director Noel Trevaskis mentioned the need to retain Rotarians following their induction. Any Rotarian, new or old would be unlikely to leave Rotary after experiencing a conference such as this which provided a summary of all that we do and provided outstanding inspiration to do even more as we strive to make the World a better place.

PRID Noel also made an important announcement that from 2021 our district will be amalgamated with Districts 9600 and 9710 to establish district 9705. District amalgamations are proceeding world wide as technology and unfortunately reducing membership allow for more economic management models of Rotary's administrative processes. This amalgamation will be favourable to our current district as all current clubs will remain part of the new district. DG Brian announced that Amanda Roach from the Rotary Club of Rylstone-Kandos had been selected as DG Nominee for the year 2021-22. This will now mean that Amanda will be a strong contender to govern the newly amalgamated districts.

During the dinner on Saturday night President Kathy was invited to make three presentations on behalf of our club. Cheques for \$6,000 each were presented to Shelter Box, the Rotary Foundation and DG Partner Carol's ARH Lift the Lid appeal. This amount included the \$15,000 bequeath to Rotary by the late PDG Bart and an additional donation by our club.

DGE Graeme Hooper announced that next year's conference will be held at Belmont 16 Foot Sailing Club on 20-22 March 2020. I encourage all members to plan early to attend.
