DISTRICT CONFERENCE CANCELLED

Our much looked forward to District Conference, due to be held next week, at Belmont 16 ft Sailing Club has been cancelled, due to the Covid 19 (Corona virus) pandemic currently causing concern worldwide.

District Governor Graeme Hooper issued the following statement on Saturday morning, delivered to all Rotarians in District 9670.

Yesterday afternoon, Conference 2020 Committee Chair Ed and myself met with the Gordon Maxwell, Operations Manager, of the Belmont 16s.

We left the meeting feeling confident that COVID-19 mitigation measures were being met by the venue.

Over the ensuing hours, I came up to date with media reports and various other experts on their viewpoints regarding the containment of COVID-19. The Federal Government were advising, that from Monday 16 March, for crowds of over 500, people should reconsider their plans. With this in mind and although our Conference is smaller than this number, a risk analysis indicated we should reconsider our position. During yesterday afternoon, I also received advice from the Australian Rotary Insurance Chair with a recommendation for Rotary Conferences and Events involving the public be cancelled.

This morning at 9:00am, I chaired a meeting of the District Management Committee (DMC) via Zoom.

A unanimous decision was reached to cancel our Rotary District 9670 "Breaking Through Barriers" Conference 2020 to be held at the Belmont 16s, The Parade, Belmont NSW 2280, from Friday 20 March to Sunday 21 March 2020.

I take this opportunity to sincerely thank each and everyone of you for the endless hours and dedication everyone has contributed over the past two and a half years.

When Sue and I took on the role of District Governor for D9670 almost three years ago, we had a vision from the start we could make our Conference something where we could dare to be different, to "Break Through Barriers". With a whole team effort, our program shaped up to be able to deliver this aspiration. However, forces beyond our control have determined otherwise.

We will now work through the logistics of the "wash up" and determine a prioritised agenda for action.

MHERV VAN VISIT TO SALAMANDER BAY- FREE MEN'S HEALTH CHECKS

Nelson Bay Rotary will be assisting in providing Free Men's Health Checks at Salamander Bay Shopping centre on Saturday March 28 and March 29. Previous clinics held at Tea Gardens and Medowie have been well attended

mherv - 'Men's Health Education Rural Van' is a Rotary project. It is a purpose-built caravan with two consulting rooms which since 2017 has toured through well over 100 centres in NSW, many of them more than once. It has a full time Registered Nurse who conducts health tests among rural men. The Men's Health Education Rural Van (mherv) is out and about in rural New South Wales to save lives. That sounds a bit dramatic perhaps, but plenty of rural men just drop dead in the paddock, because nobody saw it coming. Many men in rural and regional Australia haven't had a check-up with their doctor since they don't remember when... in fact many haven't darkened a surgery door for years! Rotary's mherv project offers a free, ten minute, non-invasive group of tests. • Blood pressure just to check the heart isn't too stressed.

• Blood sugar levels ... just a pin-prick in the finger, to make sure there's no type two diabetes ... which is manageable even if there is. • Cholesterol ... just another pin-prick to see if levels are high and need attention. High levels of any of these have virtually no symptoms and can kill.

Yet these conditions can be detected by the mherv tests and if noticed in time can easily be treated by a local family doctor. A health check with mherv is completely free. It is a community service provided by Rotary and our sponsors, particularly the Royal

Freemasons' Benevolent Institution and the Rotary Clubs of New South Wales. By the end of May 2019... 2,368 people had been tested who were recommended to contact their G.P. to arrange for a regular medical checkup. 3,136 had been advised to take their test results to their doctor, as there was a specific issue that may need treatment. 164 had been advised to seek medical advice immediately as they were at risk of suffering a serious episode, perhaps a heart attack or stroke.

It is unlikely these people would have sought medical advice without the mherv test and would soon have experienced a potentially life threatening or terminal event. These lives were probably saved by the project's efforts.

ROTARY HEALTH RESEARCH INTO MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE

Stem Cell Research for Motor Neurone Disease



PhD Scholar <u>Sally Vuong</u> will begin a stem-cell research project this year in hope of understanding why neurons die over time and more quickly in neurodegenerative diseases such as Motor Neurone Disease (MND

MND has a high mortality rate and affects more than 2000 Australians in all age groups, with a prevalence rate of 1 per 11,000. Currently, there's no known effective treatment or cure for MND, in part because we know little about how the nervous system develops. Nelson Bay Rotary will hold its annual Charity Golf 29th consecutive Charity Golf Day, being held at Nelson Bay Golf Club on Friday April 3rd 2020. With numerous other appeals being conducted recently for Bush Fire relief, the Club have found it more difficult to gain sponsorship. However many local business' and supporters of this day have ensured the day would proceed as normal, said Club President and Golf Day organiser Arja Levonpera. She thanked the many valued sponsors and players who make the day a success. The Rotary Charity Golf Day has returned over \$300,000 to our local community of the past 29 years, providing some needed funds for a wide variety of community projects and community groups.

This year's beneficiaries will be a research program being conducted by former Nelson Bay Ear, Nose and Throat Surgeon, HRMI Associate Professor Dr Kelvin Kong, Australia's first aboriginal ENT surgeon. The project will provide more efficient Indigenous Ear Disease Diagnosis especially in children. The Club has already contributed \$20,000 to this project with another \$10,000 required to meet the Club's commitment. Many local Indigenous children are assisting in the research. Additional funds, over the \$10,000 will be distributed to Bush Fire and Drought victims through Rotary projects where all funds given go directly to the victims. As a Club we have contributed over \$17,000 to Bush Fire Victims, so far this year.

Long standing sponsor Port Stephens Toyota will again provide a new Toyota Yaris for a Hole in One, while Holiday World, Salamander Bay, offer a \$10,000 holiday for a Hole in One.
