
Update on Rotary Reading Programme

Helen Ryan launched this literacy in 2003/04 at Shoal Bay when she was President of our club. It was extended to other schools: Tomaree (2006) and Anna Bay (2010). It is for children aged 7/8; "start early.. Literacy is power".

"Helen said that some children prior to starting school had not been exposed to books". And, one of her biggest thrills was being stopped in the street by a young man who thanked her for her help.

All of the schools routinely benchmark children at the beginning of term and again at the end of term. The chart below shows improvements of 15 to 40% in reading ability.

- 2011 recipient of state and national 'Pride of Australia Medals' for her work in the environment and community


