JUDY HICKS - INTERPLAST



Guest speaker Judy Hicks D9670 Chair of Interplast and President of the Rotary Club of East Maitland provided an excellent and very comprehensive presentation on the Interplast program. Interplast was established in 1987 as a joint program of Rotary and the Royal Australian College of Surgeons. The Interplast team members are volunteers comprising surgical and medical specialists working with non specialist but equally important Rotarians and ancillary medical staff.

Interplast differs from ROMAC mainly because it conducts its procedures in overseas countries ROMAC patients are brought to Australia for treatment. Patients vary from those requiring cosmetic surgery for facial and body disfigurations such as cleft palate to those suffering extreme injuries from burns and motor vehicle accidents.

Whilst the volunteer surgeons perform the medical procedures, Rotary Districts and Clubs sponsor the travel, accommodation and post operative care of patients and accompanying family member/s.

A secondary role of Interplast is training local surgeons and medical trainees brought to Australia from South Pacific, PNG and South East Asian countries. Training in surgical and medical procedures is provided in Australia by specialist volunteers and on return home better medical treatment can be provided locally. The Rotary Foundation provides some funding for the expenses incurred by the trainees. Nurse training is another critical area and simple training in good hygiene practices has saved the lives of many patients.
