Our impromptu Guest Speaker this week: Ed Parker (due to a no show of the announced speaker)



Ed talked from his PNG experience in 1963 that involved church work and also looking after 6 schools.

He observed a different learning method by the nationals, learning the P & Q's much like an apprenticeship, observe, imitate, listen, participate and MAYBE ask a question. Much different from western students, that ask question after question after question.

During that time the A-syllabus (Australian school) and T-syllabus (Territory school) was taught and it was soon found out that the western way was not the best way of teaching.

After graduating from Newcastle Uni in 2004 with a PhD in education I was asked to supervise a PNG student G. Kiki doing a PhD on arguing with his Lutheran Church Seminary not to use the western way of teaching in a 350 page thesis and later published in a booklet.

Together we started writing articles titled Challenging Westernised Teaching in PNG in 2007 and another one in 2014 saying that it also applied to all Pacific Is. and last year Education that Enables & Satisfies. Ed was facilitating him from the sideline for several years to smooth out his publications as English was his 5th language and he ended up being Academic Dean Head of a Dept. College in Fiji.

This illustrates that there are many different ways of helping people achieve their goals.
