This evening held on Thursday was very well supported with some 500 attending at West Diggers. A dozen club members either attended or assisted in some way. Included in the audience was Federal MP Meryl Swanson and State MP Kate Washington.

Local resident Don MacDonald certainly created the interest and ABC radio personality Craig Hamilton did an excellent job as facilitator of the Q&A forum. One of the panel members was local GP Tony Plummer who gave excellent insight into some of the mental health issues in our area. Visitors came from Maitland, Newcastle, the Central Coast and Sydney to attend.

As our District Australian Rotary Health Representative, I had a stand at the Forum. There was much public interest in ARH and I was far busier than I was at the recent District Conference in Dubbo. I distributed hundreds of information leaflets and DVDs on Mental Health issues.

As members may be aware Australian Rotary Health has been active in Health Research for over 30 years and for the past decade has focussed on Mental Health Research, with some \$2.45 million committed this year. Our District (9670) is leading the way so far this Rotary year as the number one fund contributor to ARH.

Members should be aware of couple of other facts including our Club's long association with ARH where our Secretary PP Don Whatham served both on the Board and was VP President of ARH. He is a Life Member and current ARH Ambassador.

It is also interesting to note that one of the keynote speakers Professor Cindy Weikert was partially funded by Australian Rotary Health when studying for her PHD.

Australia Rotary Health and Neura still have very close links, with funding provided for Mental Health Research to Neura by ARH. There have been and will be many more break throughs in both treating and understanding Mental Health issues, partially due to funding provided by Australian Rotary Health.

Our Bunnings BBQ proceeds from Saturday's BBQ will be topped up to \$1000 and be forwarded to Australia Rotary Health to further mental health research. As a Club we should be quietly proud of our support to ARH.
