Board Reports

A meeting of the combined 21/22 and 22/23 Boards was held on Wednesday night to examine the past year and discuss the year ahead.

Finance

The most pressing issue at the meeting was the setting of membership fees for the coming year. After recommendation by the Treasurer it was agreed that the annual fee would be \$300 with members once again able to pay half yearly - \$150.

During the last week a new meal charge was agreed with the caterer and effective 1st July the dinner fee will be increased to \$30.

Whilst this might seem a big hike, increases over the last few years have been absorbed and the increase is now necessary to help balance the books.

Without going into great detail, the previous \$280 membership fee was insufficient to cover District Fees of \$255 per member, plus other fixed costs in excess of \$3000 such as website, audit fees, accounting costs, banking fees (square) and honorary memberships. which in total exceed \$3000. The increased membership and dinner fees should be adequate to cover these costs.

Reflective Garden

President Doug advised that plans are proceeding but have slowed a little due to accreditation processes being undertaken at the Tomaree Hospital. There is a new manager at the Hospital and he is keen to see the project become a reality.

Binoculars

Binoculars have now been repaired and will shortly be reinstalled. Discussion re security and cost/benefit resolved that, although there is a potential for high repair costs, damage to date has been minimal in relation to the income received. (and then there is the exposure we get from our presence).

Despite the obstacles thrown up through the year, it can be seen that the Club has still managed to provide valuable service to the Nelson Bay Community.


