Behind The Badge Peter Arena



Peter Arena says he arrived in Pt Stephens at the time of 9/11 in 2001. He was expecting it might be a relatively short stay to look after his mother. He had lived his whole life in Sydney going to school there, and then staying to work in business. Peter did school at Marist brothers where discipline was very strict, and this was the case in his own family home too.

He was one of 4 boys.

The family of Italian background had arrived in Australia in 1890s so was well settled here during his child hood days. Peter's Father Nicholas Arena worked in the A.IF as an instrumenting technician and later in commercial aviation. The family is a large one now, and they meet normally once per year in Sydney. The large gathering is around 300 people. The function had to be postponed in 2020 due to COVID.

Peter did a plumbing apprenticeship after leaving school. He worked in this area and built up a business in which he was the principal for 15 years. After coming to Pt Stephens he looked for a change of direction and he moved into real estate. Peter is a licensed agent and auctioneer. His office is run with his wife Elena from home which he has done since 2003.

Peter has enjoyed sport all his life; football, athletics, boxing, martial arts and swimming. He is a regular church goer and has been a part time pastor. He has run as a candidate for the Christian Democrat Party twice. He now enjoys Biblical research and has done some singing of light music and jazz. It is always interesting to hear peoples stories. Information from Board Meeting

Candidate for Centenary Scholarship

It is a pleasure to announce that Louise Simpson who is a Counsellor at the Yacaaba Centre has been granted a scholarship to pursue her further studies in counselling. We are hoping Louise will be able attend a club meeting to speak with us in the near future.

Rotary Australia Benevolent Society Project (RABS)

After a recent address to the club the Board became aware of the difficult situation faced by a member of the community Natalie Hain who suffers from Lyme's disease. Lyme disease is not recognised as a medical condition in Australia, and hence is unable to attract funding via Medicare. Whilst the condition is debilitating, the costs are often significant and ongoing, they must be met from personal funds. Once the project is established a donation of \$2000 will be made by our club to get things running. We would then hope to encourage other groups to donate.

\$10,000 Donation to HMRI

The great success from the Golf day has allowed the club to make a substantial \$10,000 donation to HMRI for the work of Dr Kelvin Kong. His work is looking in improving hearing of indigenous children.

Connection with Probus

A previous member of our club Mike Mobbs who is now the President of Nelson Bay Mens Probus has suggested we have a stronger link with them. We will aim to invite the Probus Presidents to our club changeover, and pass information about our activities to them.

The Virtual district conference will occur on Saturday 22nd of May from 10.30 until 4 pm. Previously there was discussion as to perhaps holding a combined session at the club to log in as a group. Due to only a small number wanting this option to go ahead, there will not be any formal arrangement made.


