**NIGEL DIQUE – PORT STEPHENS SISTER CITIES.**

Nigel’s presentation outlined the history and operation of Port Stephens Sister City relationship with several international cities. The program was established in 1988 by then mayor and later local member of Parliament the late John Bartlett. It aims to promote communication between cities leading to friendships, understanding between nations and worldwide peace. The relationship began with Bellingham USA and has since extended to agreements with Kushiro, Yugawara and Tateyama Japan as well as friendship relationships with Victoria Canada, Tauranga New Zealand and Nahodka Russia.

In addition to cultural exchanges there have been sporting, dance, visual arts, choral and student visits between the cities. In 1990 Bellingham hosted the first Pacific Rim Yachting Challenge. PacRim is now held every second year and is normally attended by some 120 sailors and supporters from Bellingham USA, Victoria Canada, Tateyama Japan, Tauranga NZ, Nahodka Russia and Port Stephens. It takes place over a week and all visitors are home hosted. Hosting is rotated.



Recent highlights include a visit to Japan by the local Seaside Singers and reciprocal visit to Port Stephens by Tateyama Choir which performed at Apex Park and Soldiers Point and post Covid the visit to Kushiro and Tateyama by Hunter Bird Observers Club.

In 2024 a 30-year Anniversary Celebration will be held with a goal of involving community members and school students in understanding the importance of maintaining habitat and gaining a knowledge of the amazing flights of our migratory birds.

The Sister Cities Committee meets at Nelson Bay Bowling Club on the last Wednesday of every second month. Nigel would be happy to welcome new members to the group. Membership is free.

### THREE MINUTE TALK.

This segment of our meetings continues to be very popular and the previous week's raffle winner spends considerable time preparing an interesting presentation for the following week. This week, David Clark spoke about his brother Robert whose son Fred and 14 school friends and parents attended an educational excursion to China. One of the boys, Tyson Morris who happened to be Fred's best friend's father owned a catering company. The company was engaged to cater for 29,000 troops in Somalia in 1994. During the civil uprising Tyson Morris was killed even before the catering operation began.

David's brother Robert travelled to Somalia from his farm in Yass to support his friend David following the death of his son. Robert oversaw the growing of vegetables and managed the transportation of vegetables 3 times per week to the catering centres. The conditions were continuously surrounded by danger with workers frequently assassinated and kidnapped. Robert was involved in the rescue of two kidnapped staff members at a ransom of \$800K and \$1M respectively.

Report courtesy Chris Bartlett: This week saw the covered pergola erected at the Reflective Garden. The team from local firm Suncoast Enterprises after a final briefing from Warwick spent Thursday and Friday morning preparing materials and erecting the pergola. President Don had a site visit on Thursday to view the progress. Warwick continued to work on the seats, while Geoff Diemar spent many hours working on materials in preparation for both the raised and normal garden beds, work is to commence on the garden beds early next week. President Don has been advised that our Federal Government grant supported by MP Meryl Swanson will be in our bank account in the next few weeks. We were also advised that our application for a \$6K Community grant from Port

Stephens Council was successful. Don has completed the acceptance paperwork for both grants. We were also provided waste tipping passes by Port Stephens Council.

Warwick has now completed the construction of seating in his work shed and the seats were loaded to his trailer by Geoff, Warwick, David, John and Don this morning ready for transportation to the site. We are making real progress.

This Friday afternoon photo from Chris shows the pergola almost complete. The guttering and finishing touches will be added on Tuesday. At that stage the seating will be installed, and work will commence to build the garden beds.

Plants for the garden have been purchased and these are currently being cared for by Lesley at Doug's home. Planting will take place as the weather warms towards spring.
