### John Clarke on the 161st Anniversary of Fingal Lighthouse



Tonight we enjoyed a meeting away from the Bowling Club and were joined by members of Salamander Bay RC for an entertaining talk on the history of the Outer Lighthouse and Fingal Bay. We enjoyed some pizza and salad at the Fingal Cellars. We now know where the locals go in Fingal to hang out.

The meeting tonight was presented with the help of Tomaree Museum Association. Both John and Doug Cross who helped with the presentation, are members of the group. The banners, projector and slides we viewed were through the Museum Association. It does seem unusual that an area such as Pt Stephens with a rich history does not have a permanent home to store and display items from the past. The Tomaree Museum Association is doing its best to change this situation. They have begun a collection, and will display some of it through pop-up exhibitions around the Bay. John had written books on various historical themes including The Oystermen, The Broughton Islands , and Commercial Fishing in the Bay when the opportunity came to cover the Outer Lighthouse, He realised it was not likely to be covered by others and took this on as a project. The photo from 1893 showing the lighthouse keeper's family playing cricket near the lighthouse was found in a box under the bed of an elderly member of the community who wondered if it might be of interest. The tragic loss of the Lighthouse keepers residence occurred in 1991 due to fire, when there had been no management of the property by authorities. The site sadly will never be restored. The residence constructed of sandstone blocks from the Hawkesbury and cedar beams was a magnificent historical building which never varied in temperature by more than a few degrees. There were a couple of clues given as to where to fish around the island, but sadly if you missed the talk we can't give away any secrets.

On Monday morning, Warwick, Geoff Diemar and Chris were on site early to commence construction on the raised garden beds. A lot of pre installation work was carried out by Geoff to ensure an easier installation process. Warwick and Geoff completed the majority of the work in the morning before returning in the afternoon to install the timber sides for the raised garden beds.

On Tuesday morning, the guttering was professionally installed on covered pergola to complete this excellent construction. Chris performed a site cleanup, an easy task as the tradies have removed most of the excess rubbish. The tradesmen who have worked on the site have been terrific and a special thank you to the project managers who organised them.

Work on the filling the garden beds spreading more soil, installing the watering system, water features and other tasks will commence in earnest during the next few weeks. Some feedback from Hunter Health indicates plenty of excitement and enthusiasm as the project is starting to take shape.
