Our guest speaker on Thursday night was Centenary Scholarship recipient Louise Simpson, a counsellor with the Yaccaaba Centre in Nelson Bay. Chair of the Scholarship committee Ian Brigden said the committee were impressed with work Louise is doing for the local community and the club is looking forward to Louise's progress. Louise will be study Psychology at Monash University, specialising in the area of Domestic Violence.

Loise is married with two children and lives in Boat Harbour and has worked at the Yacaaba centre for the past two years. She gave the members a good overview of some of the issues facing the Yacaaba Centre with counselling offered to both female, men and children clients. Domestic violence is on the increase as is homelessness in our local area. There is very little housing available in the Tomaree area. Louise has also had experience as a Managing Director and worked as a volunteer counsellor with Lifeline. She thanked President Elect Doug and Community Service Director Milton for their support in applying for the grant. We wish Louise well in her studies and the great job she is doing at the Yacaaba Centre.


