Always short of money.....



Our speaker for the night was Neil Hansford, deputy commander of Marine Rescue Port Stephens. Neil represents the largest volunteer organisation on the Tomaree Peninsula with its 220 members. They are also a "Registered Training Organisation" (RTO) and are able to issue Certificates level III and IV for various skills connected

with marine rescue operations, like radio communications, First Aid, off shore navigation and the like.

That training and these skills are absolutely necessary as Marine Rescue is serious business that exposes the actual boat crews to very real dangers

where they have to rely on a professional support from the base. It can take over a year of training and learning before a volunteer is fully qualified, either to operate in the communications centre or one of the rescue vessels.

Marine Rescue PS is part of Marine Rescue NSW with a head office in Cronulla and - as a non government Emergency Service organisation - operates within the framework provided by the State Emergency and Rescue management Act 1989. That means that the communications centre at the Inner Light not only handles marine assistance and distress calls but also operates

as control centre for the Lower Hunter RFS and takes calls from "triple zero" operators and pages RFS crews.

Apart from managing the "Inner Light" grounds and museum (the only historical museum on the Tomaree Peninsula), Marine Rescue PS operates an official weather station that contributes to the BOM network and provides reliable local weather information - not only for the private boaties and fishermen but

also for the local cruise operators and other commercial enterprises.

All these activities cost over \$140,000 a year and the government contributes only 16% of that. The rest of the cost has to be scraped together with donations, the gift shop, fund raisers and other activities like

scattering ashes. On the other hand: the government requires that Marine Rescue operates up to date and well maintained boats, like the recently bought PS31 "John Thompson" (\$ 850,000). Less than half of the owners of rescued vessels make a donation to cover the

cost of their rescue operation. Marine Rescue needs more community awareness about their funding problems. Their volunteers do a professional job and deserve - like RFS and SES - more financial recognition. Thanks, Neil for a great presentation; we'll spread the word and keep it in mind.
