NEWS FROM THE BOARD

The final Board meeting of the 2020-21 Rotary year was held on Wednesday night. During the meeting members of the current Board worked together with those from the incoming Board to ensure a smooth hand over and continuity of the fine achievements of the current year.

It was pleasing to approve the membership of new members Erin Brinkley and Craig Paroissien. Erin and Craig will be inducted as members of our club at changeover. Sadly, we received news that due to changed working conditions Andrew Downey, Narelle and Doug Melhuish will not be in a position to continue their Rotary membership next year. All are thanked for their contribution to Rotary. Fellow Board members thanked Narelle for the outstanding work she has done as club treasurer during the year. It was a pleasure to work with her and she will be sadly missed.

We had reports of the continuing success of the KIVA project. For a very small investment our club has been able to fund start up businesses and small projects for a number of people in overseas countries. Each is provided a small loan and as the project becomes operational the loan is paid back. This money is then relent to another person for another project. Chelsea has been managing this project on our behalf for three years.

More pleasing news from Youth Director Lesley was that ROADWHYS is to recommence after last year's cancellation due to COVID. Sessions will be held at Tomaree High and St Phillips College in coming months. Pleasing news also that the primary school reading program has recommenced at Shoal Bay and Tomaree and will shortly do so at Anna Bay.

Proof that a small but frequent donation can add up was provided by the announcement by Director Kathy reported that our \$2.50 weekly dinner donations had added to a total of \$1497.50 to the Rotary Foundation. This was despite not being able to conduct meetings for several months due to COVID. This club initiative will commence its 25th year of operation in the coming year and has raised over \$65,000.

A donation of \$1000 was made to D9670 Science and Engineering Challenge to assist the event which promotes the study of science, technology, engineering and maths subjects at secondary and university level. We will also support the local Science Discovery Day for primary schools. We also made a \$1000 donation to Hope Cottage which operates at the Nelson Bay Anglican Church. The program assists those who are homeless and experiencing a difficult period in their life.

Our club's Centenary of Rotary in Australia celebration has been a wonderful event. Locally Rotarians have participated in the planting of 100 trees at Tom O'Dwyer Oval. This event highlighted Rotary's most recent goal of caring for our environment, particularly with an emphasis of sharing this with youth. Local school children and our local Port Stephen Council joined our club members in this initiative. We plan to place a plaque on site acknowledging Rotary's contribution during the past 100 years. The End Trachoma raffle raised considerable funds to assist the eradication of this eye disease which particularly affects indigenous children in remote communities. Sanitary and care packages will be provided together with education packages guiding their usage. The goal is to promote improved health outcomes, less disease particularly ocular and less disruption to schooling. The Centenary celebration provided an opportunity for local Rotarians to celebrate collectively. The gathering at Murrays of over 100 Rotarians and friends from our club, the Rotary Clubs of Salamander Bay, Raymond Terrace and Medowie - Williamtown was a wonderful opportunity to celebrate and enjoy the spirit of Rotary whilst demonstrating very clearly what Rotary is about, namely Service Above Self.
