CLUB ASSEMBLY & BOARD MEETING REPORT.

Our outgoing board met with the incoming board last night for the final board meeting of this Rotary year. This meeting will allow a smooth transition in management of our club programs and operation to ensure continuity and efficiency as we enter our 67th year of Rotary service.

The Tomaree Community Hospital Garden project is entering an exciting stage having progressed to the position where we are starting to form the gardens and commence landscaping. All land forming, concreting, brick laying, garden bed construction and the garden shelter are complete. Soil is to be transported into the beds with a small bobcat machine which we are waiting to hire. As the machine operates, we will require member volunteers to bucket or wheelbarrow the garden soil into the beds. Once the beds are filled the final touches to the timberwork and planting can take place. This too, will require members to volunteer their time. Simultaneously, the recognition wall plaque will be manufactured and erected and the water feature and irrigation system installed. All will be ready for the official opening planned for September. We continue to gain community donations.

Board members have been busy preparing the annual report, finalising finances, and preparing the changeover dinner. Ella and Lesley have organised the venue at the landmark Resort and the Nelson Way restaurant has offered a comprehensive menu from which guests may choose. The program has been set and invitations sent out. Please make your payment of \$45 per head to the club account as soon as possible.

The combined boards have set the club dues at \$100 for the coming Rotary year. This was set following a thorough study of our club finances by Treasurer Geoff. The Board recognised that the increasing annual subscription was a factor in our difficulty to attract new members. Geoff has redirected contributions made by members throughout each year into fee supplementation. A request was made for members to pay the \$100 into the club account subscription before 30 June 2023.

The Board endorsed donations of \$1,000 to Australian Rotary Health, \$500 to Interplast, \$500 to ROMAC, \$500 to the Rotary Foundation and \$250 to DG Neville Parsons Partner's Project. This brings our annual giving to over \$16,000. Full details will be available at the Club Changeover and in the annual report.

President Elect Ella invited members to participate in the planning process for next year. She welcomes suggestions from members in relation to projects which the club may consider. Club committees are to become more active, and Ella has flagged the possibility of reducing the frequency of club dinner meetings. Ella plans to address the need for inducting new members and already the endorsement of the new fee structure marks an immediate start of this process.
