## TREE PLANTING AT ANNA BAY SCHOOL

On Monday June 18, all members and their partners, and any family members who would like to attend a Rotary tree planting ceremony at Anna Bay Public School, Gan Gan Road Anna Bay. The ceremony will start at 2pmn when President Kathy and School Principal Matt Freeman, along with the school captains will plant a Wollemi Pine next to the schools' Anzac Memorial, following recognition of our Club, Bunnings Taylor's Beach and other donors, Bunnings are supplying the trees, plants and bushes and will be represented by Lauren Dennison. It is envisaged all pupils will attend this part of the ceremony. At the completion of this task, we will move to the proposed sensory garden site, where a number of trees, bushes and plants will be planted to make this garden a reality. This area will be pre-prepared by Anna Bay School Staff. We will be assisted by year 1 and 2 class children, who are looking forward to this event. All year 1 and 2 students will receive a special colouring sheet, designed by Henk Tobbe, which describes the positive effect trees have on the environment. These colouring in forms will be returned to the school and the best work will be displayed on Bunnings notice board. The final part of the ceremony will be held near the Netball courts on the western side of the school where around a dozen trees will be planted on an banked area, again assisted by the year 1 & 2 students.

Members are asked to wear their "work shirts" (polo's) and bring a spade, just in case. Henk will be taking photos which we nope to publish in the local press and in the RDU magazine. This a great community event for the school and our Club, meeting the World President Ian Riseley, request for every Rotarian to plant a tree during his year as World President. DG Helen has indicated a round 3000 trees have already been planted in District 9670, which is fantastic considering we have 1130 members!!! in the District. We are hoping to have a good attendance on Monday.

A second ceremony to plant trees and bushes donated by Port Stephens Council for our Gan Gan Lookout project is planned, for Sunday June 24. This will be confirmed next week, and means that the Club's 51 members and honorary members will have been recognised. ### MEMBER UPDATE ON MEETING WITH PORT STEPHENS COUNCIL

During the week, Secretary Don Whatham, VP John Stuhmcke and Community Service Director Chris Bartlett met with Port Stephens Council Mayor Ryan Palmer and Chief Engineer John Matuich at Raymond Terrace. Three matters of importance to our Club were discussed and edited report is as follows, following a verbal report offered by Chris & Don at our meeting this week.



#### TOWN CLOCK

Chris outlined this project was first mooted in 2013 and since then progress has always been behind time, to the point where recent correspondence between our Club and Council resulted in Wednesday's meeting. Prior to the meeting, long term Rotary Richard Turner accepted the role as Town Clock Chair and has formed a small committee to assist him with this. Much information was prepared for Council prior to the meeting, which indicated we had \$12,000 in a Nelson Bay Rotary Club Service Account ready to be spent. (More background information is available on request).

Mayor Ryan and Engineer John were aware of the Club's position. Mayor Ryan also outlined he is chasing millions of dollars for the Nelson Bay Town Centre Beautification and upgrade and the Funds if secured would not be available until the 2019/20 financial year. Bearing this in mind, four options were discussed at the meeting as outlined by Chris

- 1. Move the Clock to Apex Park, along with other things like the Community Notice Board. Commencement date 2/3 years. The meeting felt this would not be a good option.
- 2. Place the Town Clock on the Roundabout near Nelson Bay Bowling Club. The safety issues excluded this option.
- 3. Remain with the status quo, place the Clock outside the Post Office (our preferred option). The time frame for commencement unfortunately would be 3 to 4 years.
- 4. Move the project to the Yacaaba Street Extension site, work to commence immediately and if requested the Clock to be moved back to the Post Office site in say 4 years.

The Club Board felt Option 4 was the best solution as we want to deliver on this project, after a 5 year hiatus. Secretary Don will be writing to PSC Chief Engineer informing of the Club's choice and asking for a site meeting with himself and Richard Turner and team to discuss the way forward. It might be noted the Chief Engineer is an enthusiastic town clock fan, so hopefully we can use his knowledge to assist us progress this project.

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICE SHED & SPORTING OVALS NELSON BAY**



Don and Chris gave a report on discussions regarding the proposed sporting complex and ovals upgrade plan currently being mooted by PS Council. Part of the proposal would see the Council Depot relocated to another site, probably near the recycling centre at Salamander Bay. The current site is on Crown Land. The Community service shed and containers service 6 community volunteer groups, including our Club, Soldiers Point Lions, Salamander Bay Rotary, the Action Club, Graffiti Removal group and the Historical Society.

All would be affected with the relocation. The PSC Depot is on Crown Land and Council will have to move at some point of time. However, this is not envisaged in the near future.

Don highlighted that our Club is now registered as an interested party in any Development applications for the Sporting complex, or relocation of the Council's depot, and we will be involved (along with the other Community groups) should this occur. If you require any further information on either matter, please contact Don, VP John or Chris.

Secretary Don will be writing to Council confirming the discussions held with them and the Board's and member's decisions regarding the Town Clock - with the intent of moving the project forward and continuing our great working relationship with Port Stephens Council.

Rotary and its partners in the **Global Polio Eradication Initiative** are strengthening the lines of communication by giving mobile phones to health workers in Pakistan and Nigeria, where a single text message could save a life.

In Pakistan, Rotary has been working to replace traditional paper-based reporting of maternal and child health information, including polio immunization data, with mobile phone and e-monitoring technology.

Community health workers across the nation have received more than 800 phones through a partnership with Rotary, the Pakistani government; Telenor, the country's immunications provider; and Eycon, a data monitoring and
