Area Governor Laurie Easter capably assisted by Assistant Area Governor Bruce Moy represented DG Neville at the Changeover. We were also pleased to welcome Mayor and Honorary member Ryan Palmer, Greg & Paula Flux, Lyn Moffitt, Val Morris, Harry Parker President of the Rotary Club of Salamander Bay and many partners to our changeover. We thank John Stuhmcke for setting up a P/A system and the Nelson Way for providing a great two course dinner which was enjoyed by all.

President Don presented the 2022-2023 Annual Report (previously forwarded to all members and published on dacDB and ClubRunner) prior to making several important presentations. President Don presented a Paul Harris Fellowship to Jenny Craike and PHF ruby to Geoff Diemar. Details of these awards are published below. An immortal badge representing a \$100 donation to the Rotary Foundation Endowment Fund was presented to Paula Flux by Henk Tobbe. Doug Craike passed on the symbolic Rip Van Winkle cup to Warwick Mathieson.

The following donations were announced: Port Stephens Suicide \$104.28; Tomaree Museum \$349.28; Local Schools Presentation Days \$1000; Yacaaba Centre \$6050; Ari Bennett \$500; J Kashan \$250; RAWCS Central West flood appeal \$2500; ShelterBox \$2000, Anzac Day books for schools \$125: Port Stephens Koala Hospital \$1046.65; Australian Rotary Health \$1000; Rotary Foundation \$500; Interplast \$500; ROMAC \$500; District Governor's Partner's project \$250. The list does not include the money spent to date on the construction of the Tomaree Hospital Garden.

We continued to support the Women's Refuge at the Yacaaba Centre with monthly donations of \$550 and regular garden and general maintenance.

The \$50K Tomaree Hospital Community Garden Project planned last year was completed with planting and finishing touches to be finalised. The project was assisted by \$20K Federal and \$6K PSC grants and community donations.

President Don inducted President Elect Ella who outlined her plans for the club during the next year. Ella's first goal is to seek to increase the membership of our club. She has proposed several themed dinners away from our usual venue which will be attractive to all. The new board has announced a significantly reduced club subscription which will also assist the membership drive. A major project to follow completion of the Hospital Garden will provide an excellent introduction to Rotary service to new members. Ella pledged to continue support to the Yacaaba Centre.

President Ella introduced her new Board. John Stuhmcke (Vice President), Lesley Freeman (Youth), Geoff Diemar (Treasurer), Don Whatham (Secretary), Jim Booth (Community), John Cropley (International), Geoff Robinson (Vocational) and Warwick Mathieson (Sargeant-at Arms).
