TIM IRELAND - ON TOUR - LIFE AS A PROFESSIONAL GOLFER.



Guest speaker and former member Tim Ireland provided an interesting and entertaining presentation about life on the professional golf circuit with some interesting glimpses of the many famous and accomplished golfers he had competed with and assisted over many years. Tim has been a member of the PGA since 1968, was the Ansett Golf Co-ordinator from 1987 to 1994 and a director of The Ultimate Golf Challenge since 2005. Tim has played in 15 Australian Open Golf Championships and in many prominent golf events both in Australia and overseas. He has competed against the best golf professionals during his lifetime of service to golf.

Tim's current work with The Ultimate Golf Challenge provides travel services and event organisation for both professional and amateur players. Tim's talk covered some interesting aspects of life on the circuit and how golf can make news for good and not so good reasons. He spoke of the emergence of Australian golfers with Cameron Smith recently winning the British Open at St Andrews and Australian Ladies Champion Mingee Lee on top of the World rankings. Mingee has an average drive of 259.9metres.

Tim provided an overview of the controversial Saudi Arabian financed LIV Tour organised by Greg Norman. This event features staggering prize money and \$100M contracts attracting some of the world's leading players. The

suspension of these players from PGA TOUR events is being challenged in court by Greg. Tim also related some scary travel experiences on airlines he had arranged for himself and leading players as they flew between tournaments. We were given an insight into the personal lives of players like Ian Baker-Finch and stories about the performances of the game's legends such as Kel Nagle and Gary Player.

John Cropley winner of last week's raffle provided an entertaining three-minute talk. John took us back to less politically correct times and the speaking tour to Australia by Michael Parkinson. John described how Michael's interviews with people such Barry Jones, Jacqui Weaver and Barry Humphries (Les Patterson/Edna Everage) allowed comedy to push the limits.
