TOMAREE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Our meeting this week was held at Tomaree Community College an institution that owes its existence to Nelson Bay Rotary Club. Nelson Bay Primary School was originally established at Fly Point in **1886**.

In **1893** Captain John Dalton donated 2 acres of land to the Education Department for educational purposes.

A building was constructed that year and the school moved to the current College site where it remained until **1984** when it moved to Wahgunyah Road. The site was operated by TAFE until **1988** when Tafe moved to the new Tomaree Education Centre at Salamander Bay.

The buildings were donated to Tomaree Community College with the proviso that they be moved to a new site. As no site could be fund the College "squatted" for some years.

In **1998** the Education Department decided to sell the site meaning the College would be without a home.

Fortunately, the Departments plans were thwarted when it was determined that the site had to remain as an educational facility (as per Captain Dalton's caveat in the Title Document). This meant that the land had no <u>alternate</u> commercial value.

In **2013** the College came to an agreement with the state Government to purchase the site and the College now hold the Freehold Title.

Over the years the management of the College has vested in Boards consisting primarily of Nelson Bay Rotarians including: Sam Snape, Gordon Treble, Warwick Mathieson, Doug Bairstow, Peter Buckley, Don Whatham, John Stumchke, Henk Tobbe and Helen Ryan. Ella Clarke was CEO until her retirement in 2014.

The original Bell from the Fly Point School was souvenired for posterity and safe keeping by Rtn Danny Caroll and was refurbished by Warwick Mathieson and returned to the college in 2000

More about the College:

Following dinner CEO Linda Drake filled us in on some of the more recent achievements and future plans for the College:

The College offers Accredited Courses in such things as Aged Care, Child Care, Information Technology and Hospitality.

Other work-related courses include, WH&S Construction for the Building Industry, First Aid, Small Business, Bookkeeping, RSA, RCG, Massage.

Reading Writing, Spelling and Maths for adults including non-English speaking Adults is also a large part of the local provision.

In 2014 plans for a childcare centre were prepared but until now there were no funds available. However in 2022 a \$900,000 State Government Grant was approved for the construction of a preschool facility.

In the meantime, Out Of School Hours care (OOSH) has been provided since 2018.

Like everything Covid has had a lasting effect on the College resulting in an increase in online learning.
