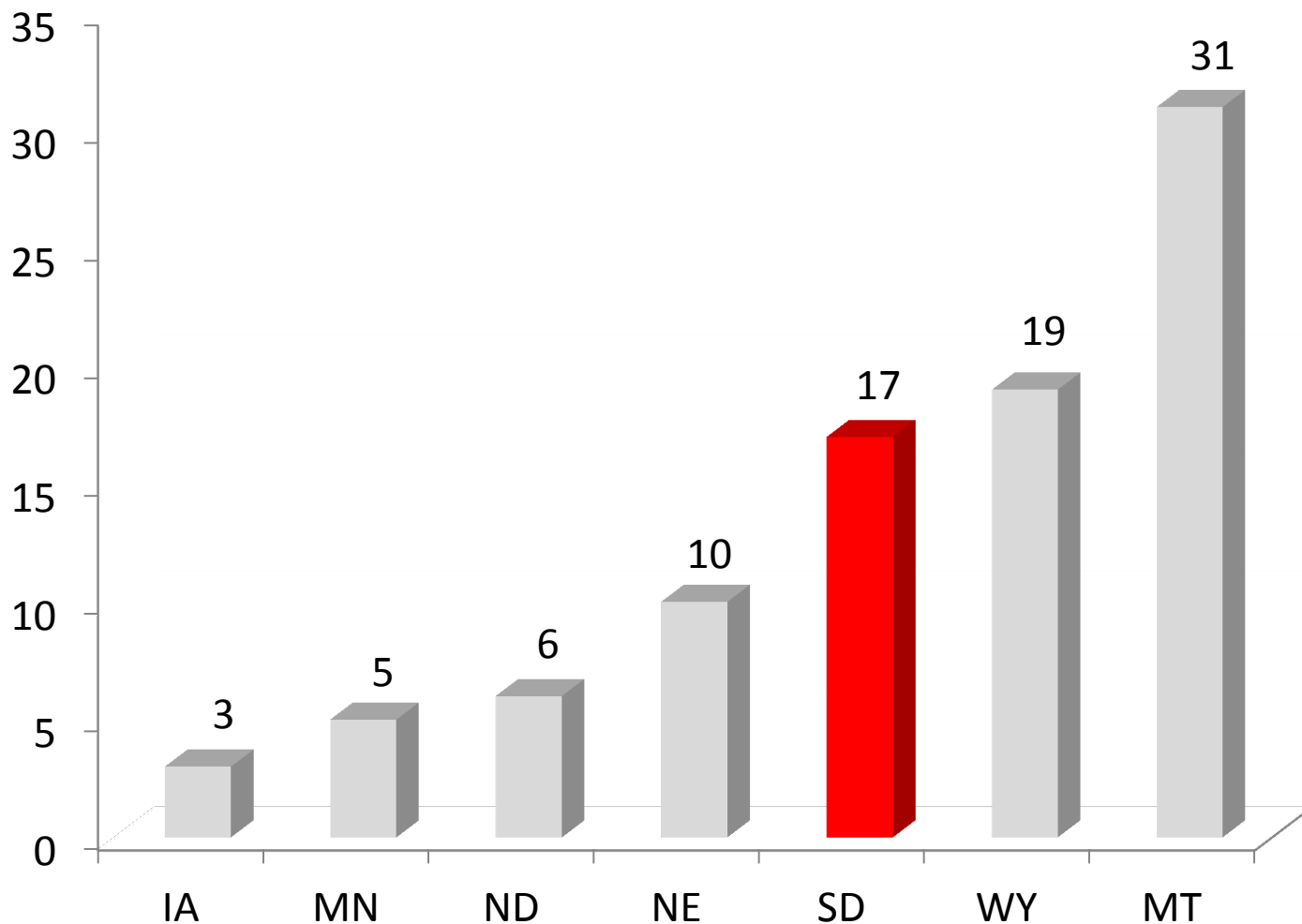

## South Dakota Compared to bordering states Overall rank - 2014

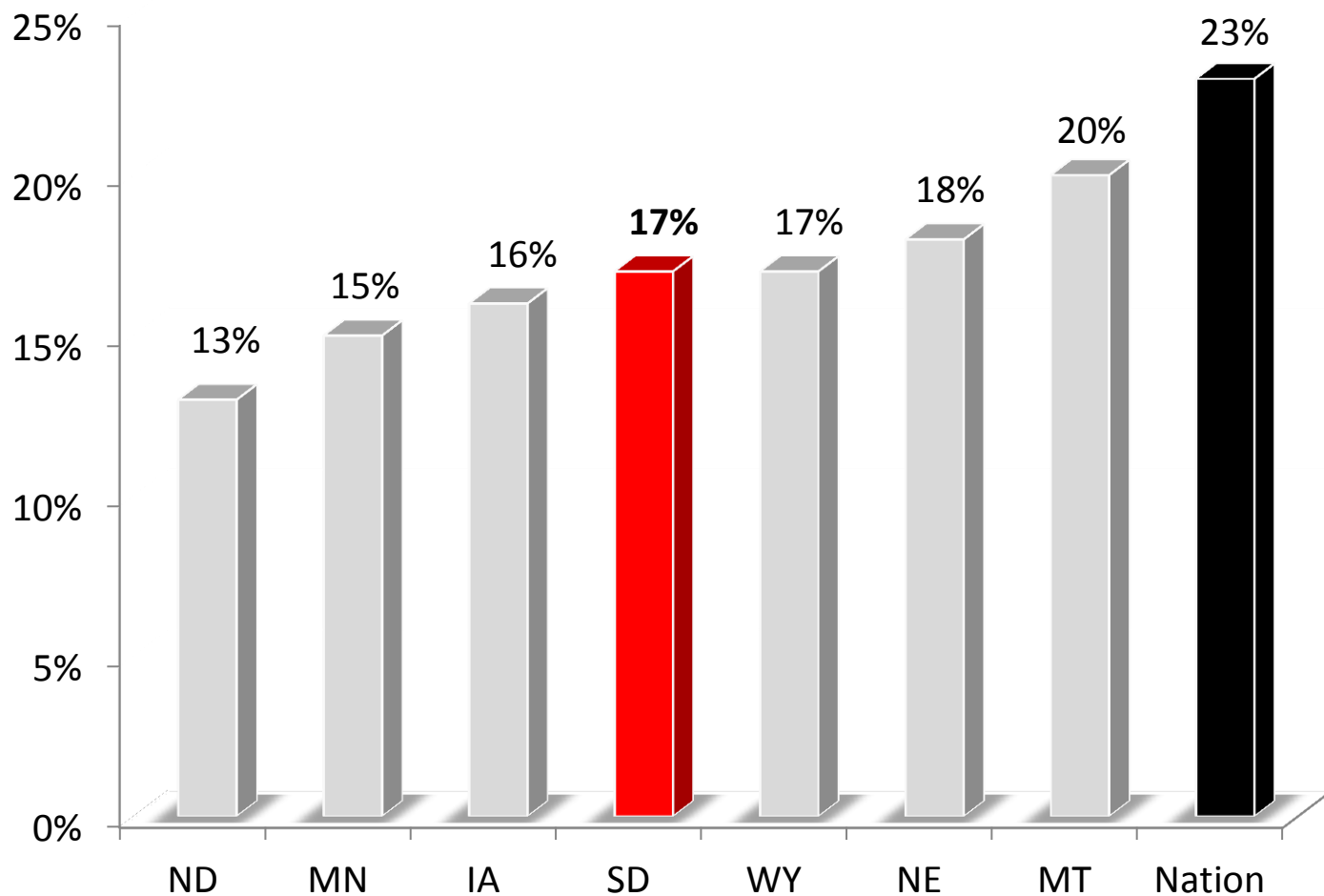

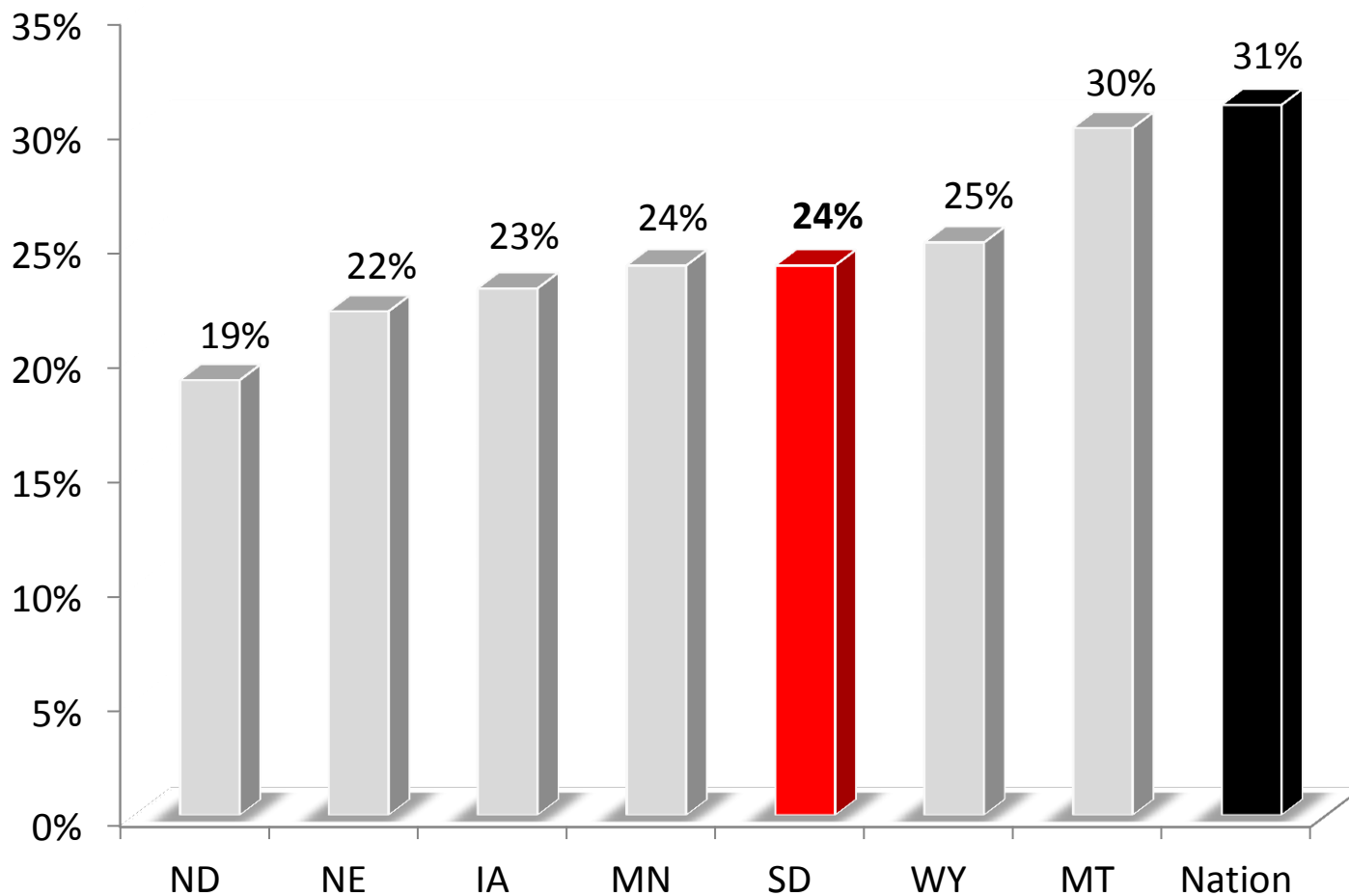

*(income below \$23,283 for a family of two adults and two children in 2012)*

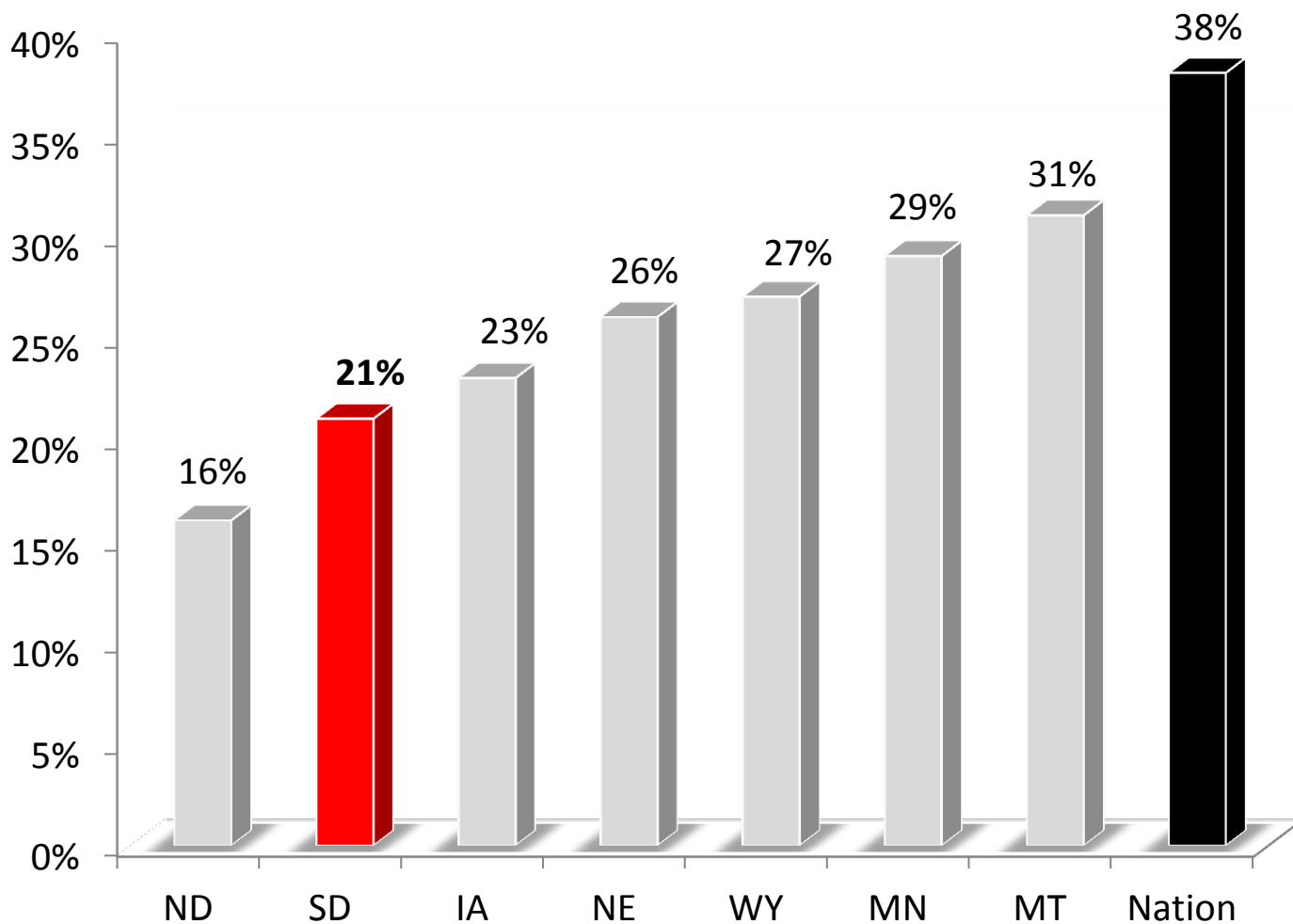




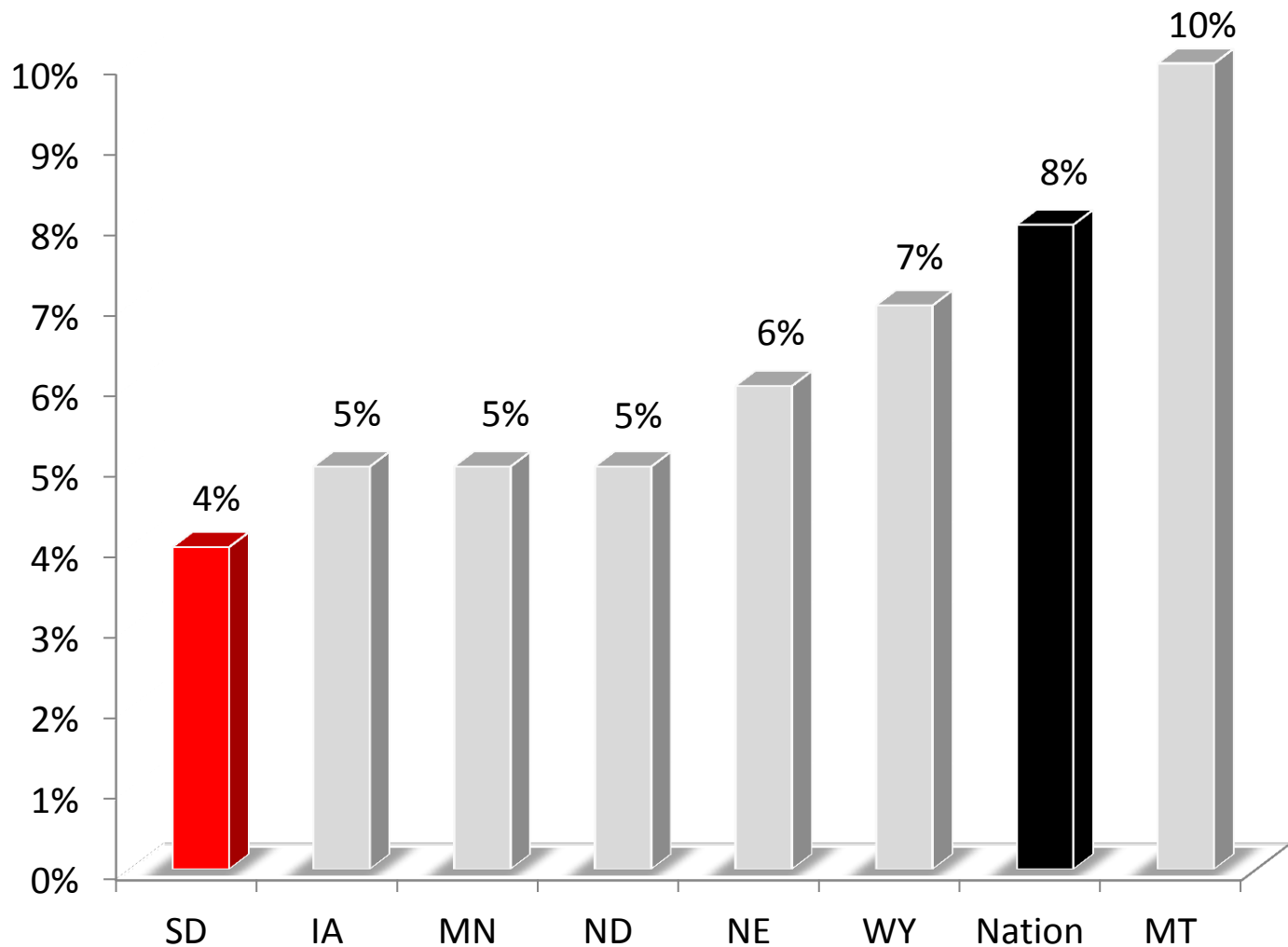
**South Dakota Compared to the Nation & Bordering States**

**not attending school and not working, 2012**

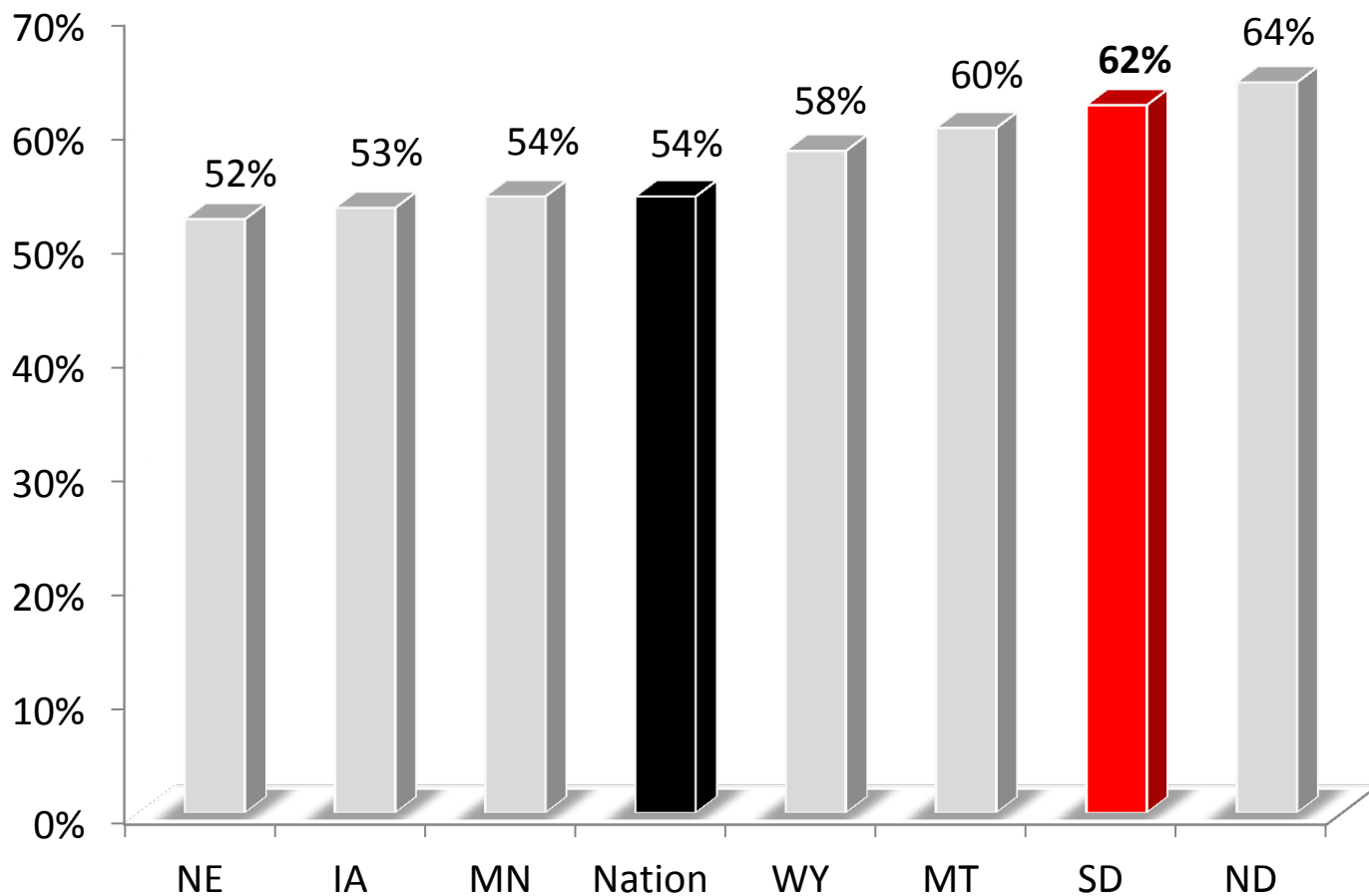

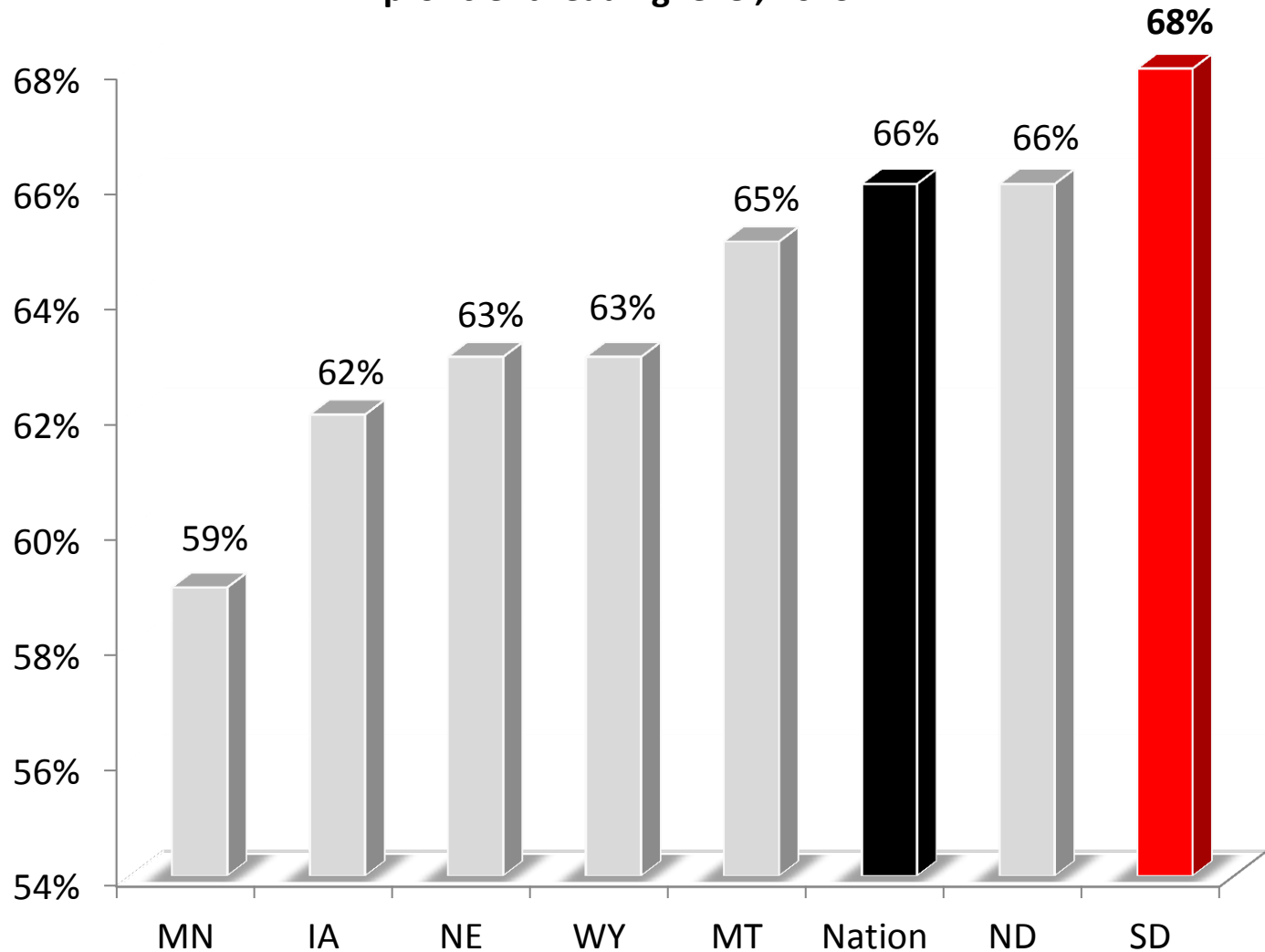

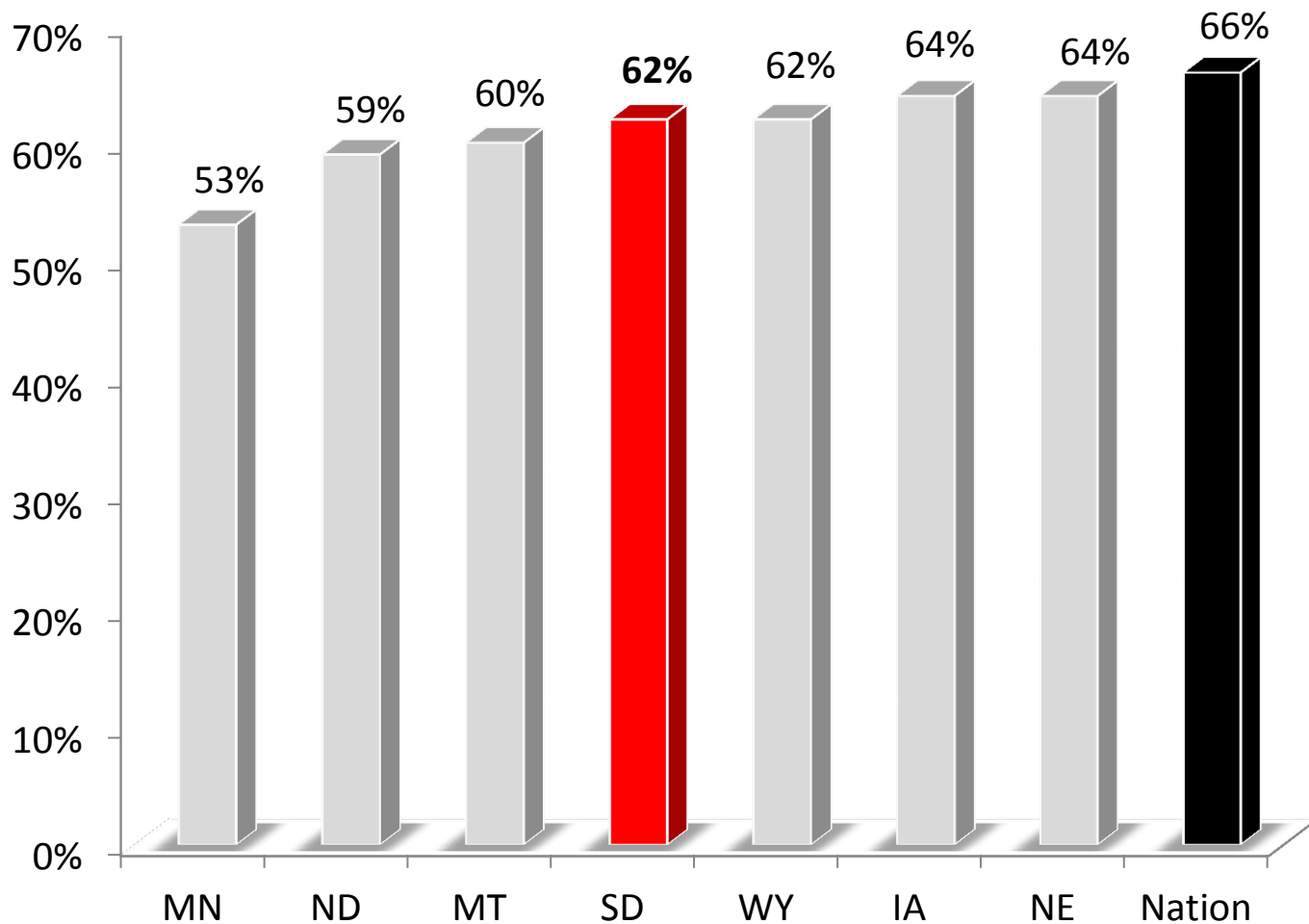
**South Dakota Compared to the Nation & Bordering States**

**2010-12**



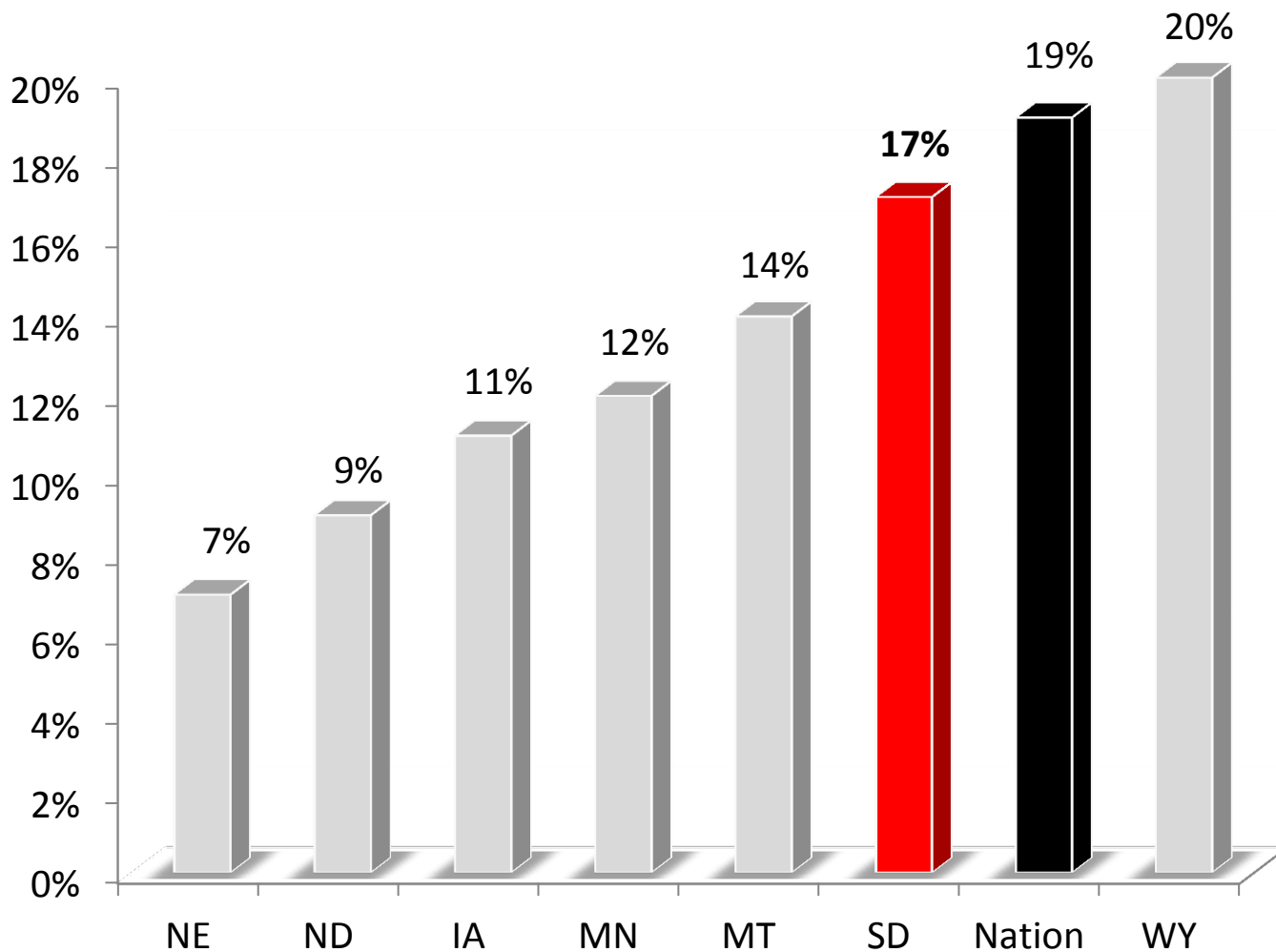
**Percent of 4th graders who scored below

**2011-12**

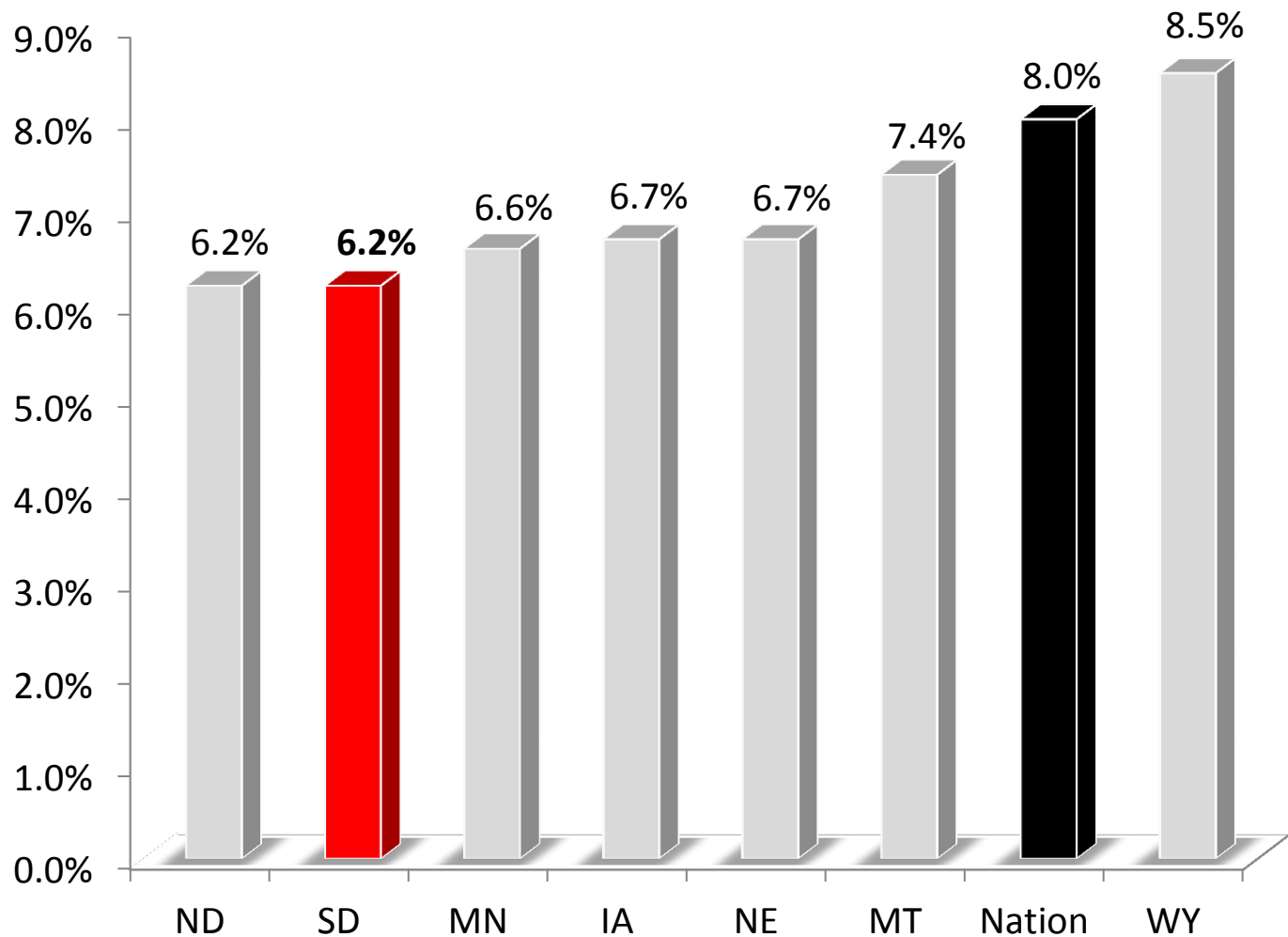




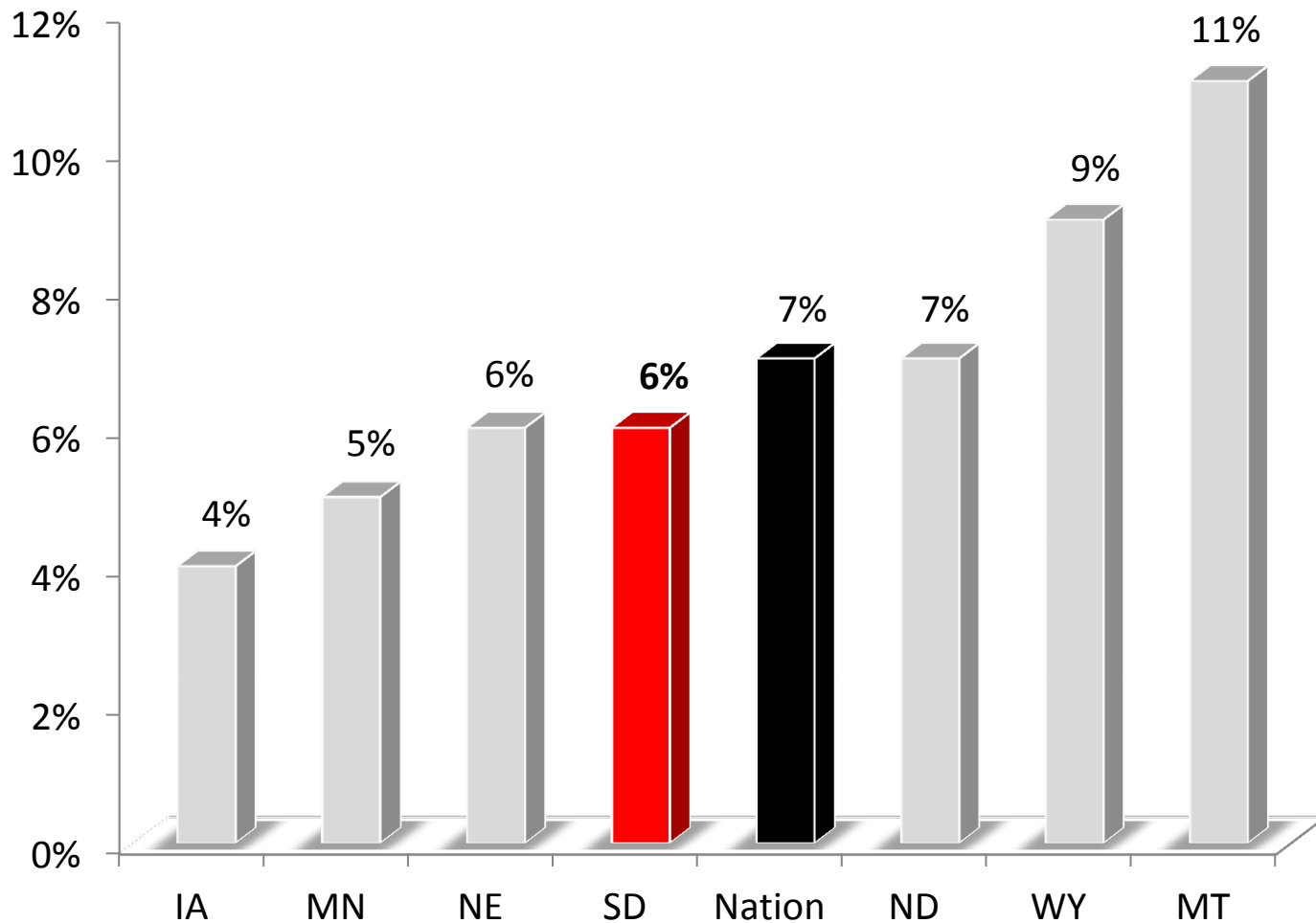

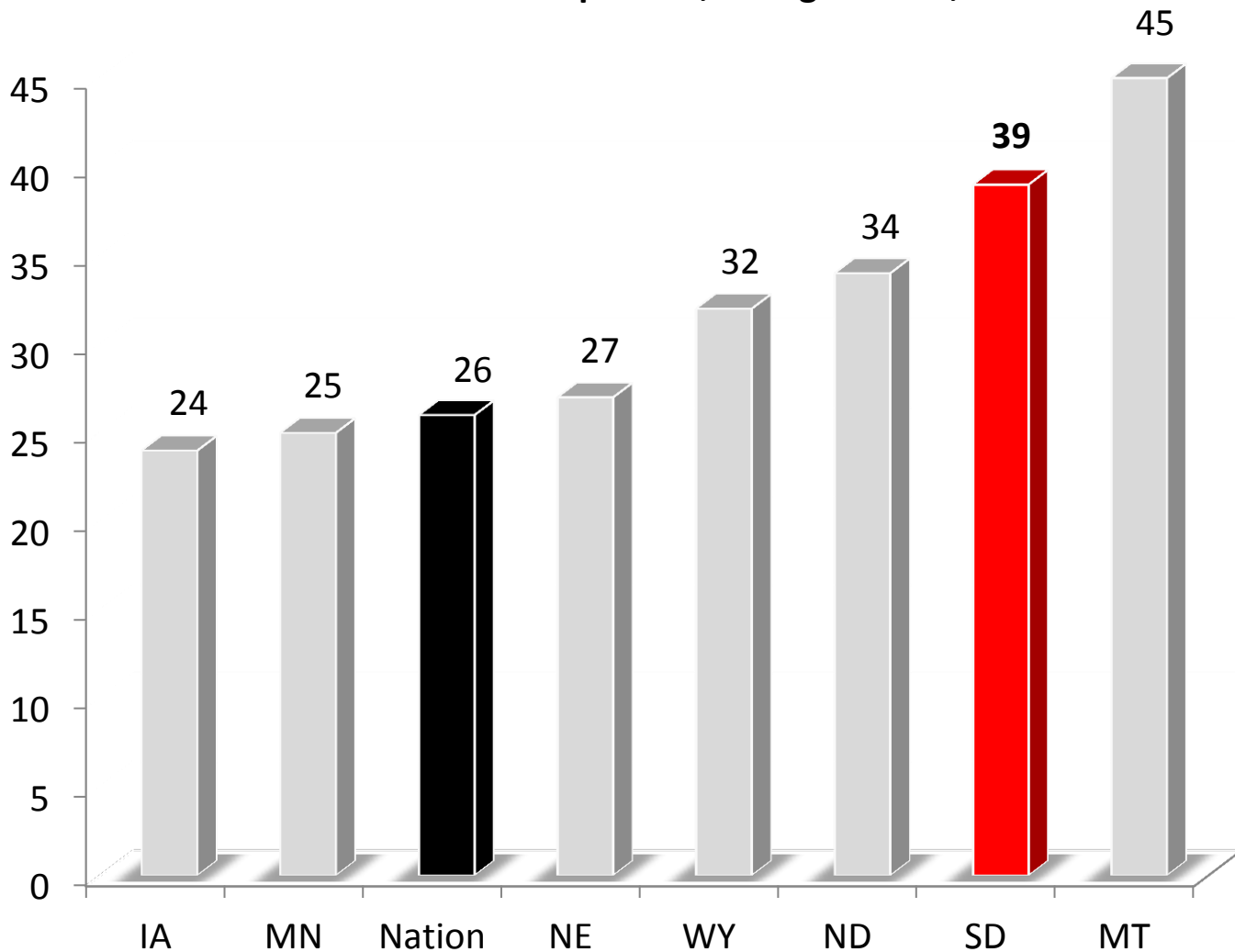
### South Dakota Compared to the Nation & Bordering States Percent low-birthweight babies, 2012



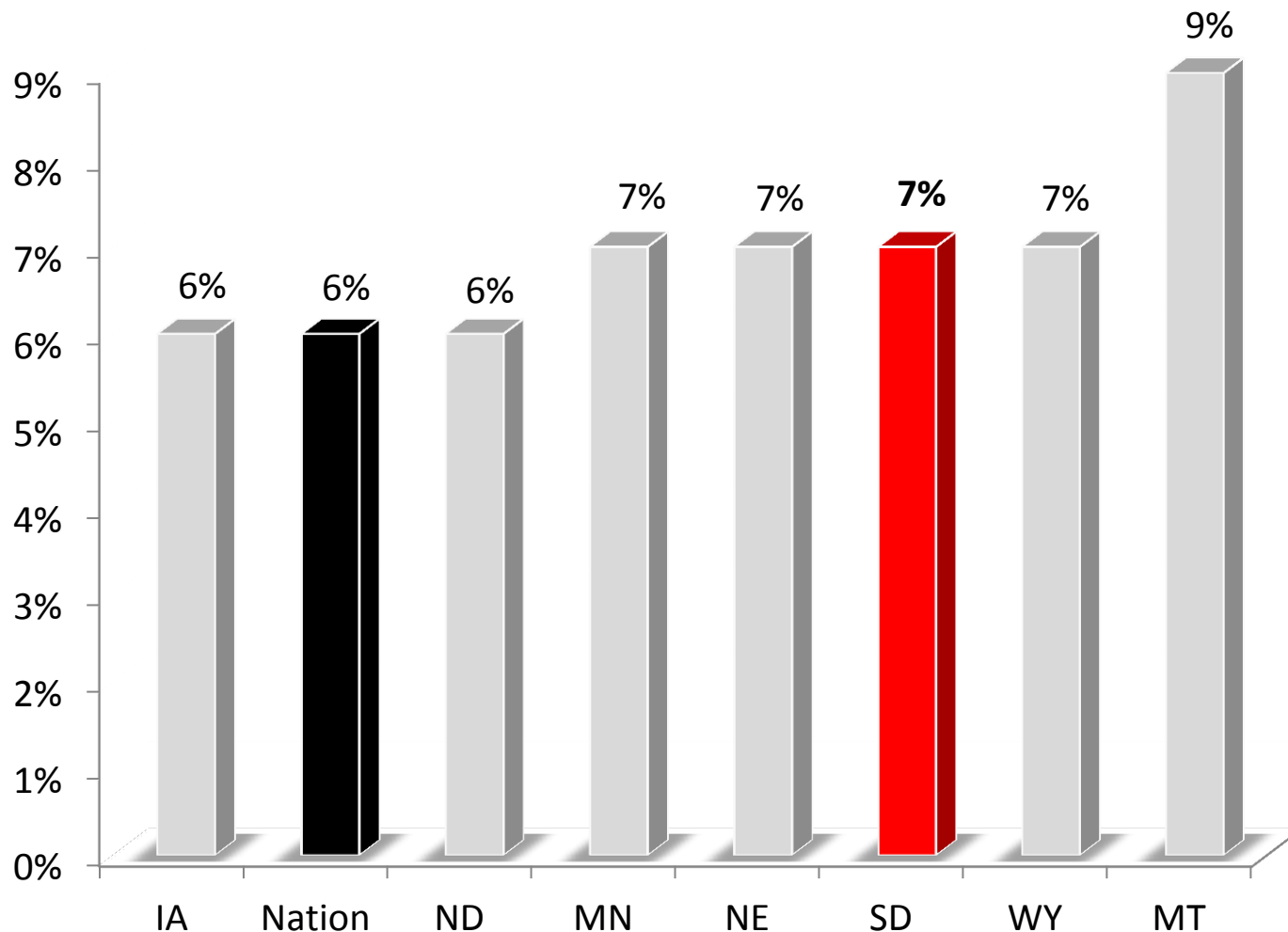
### South Dakota Compared to the Nation & Bordering States Percent of children without health insurance, 2012

**in the past year, 2011-12**

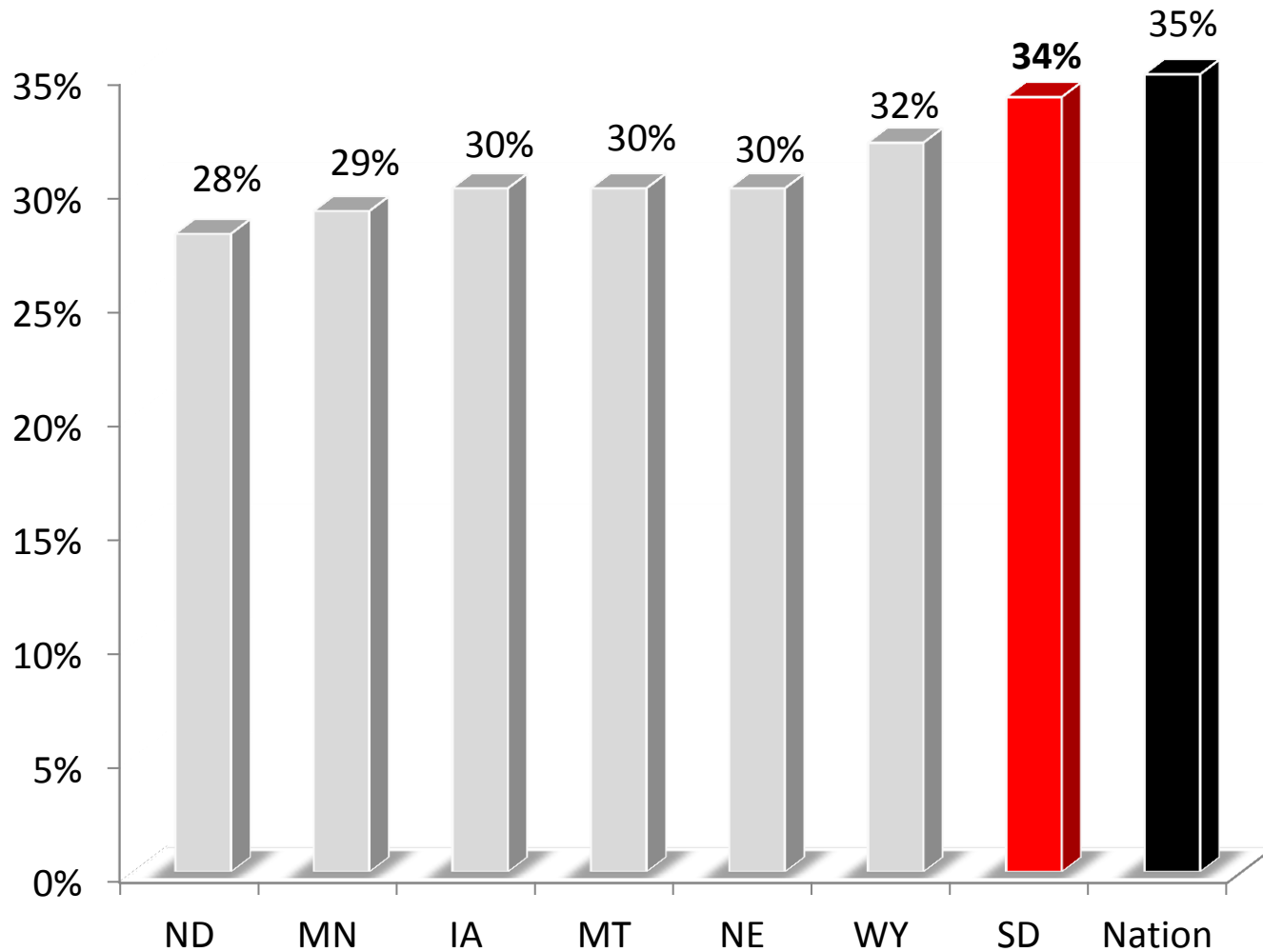




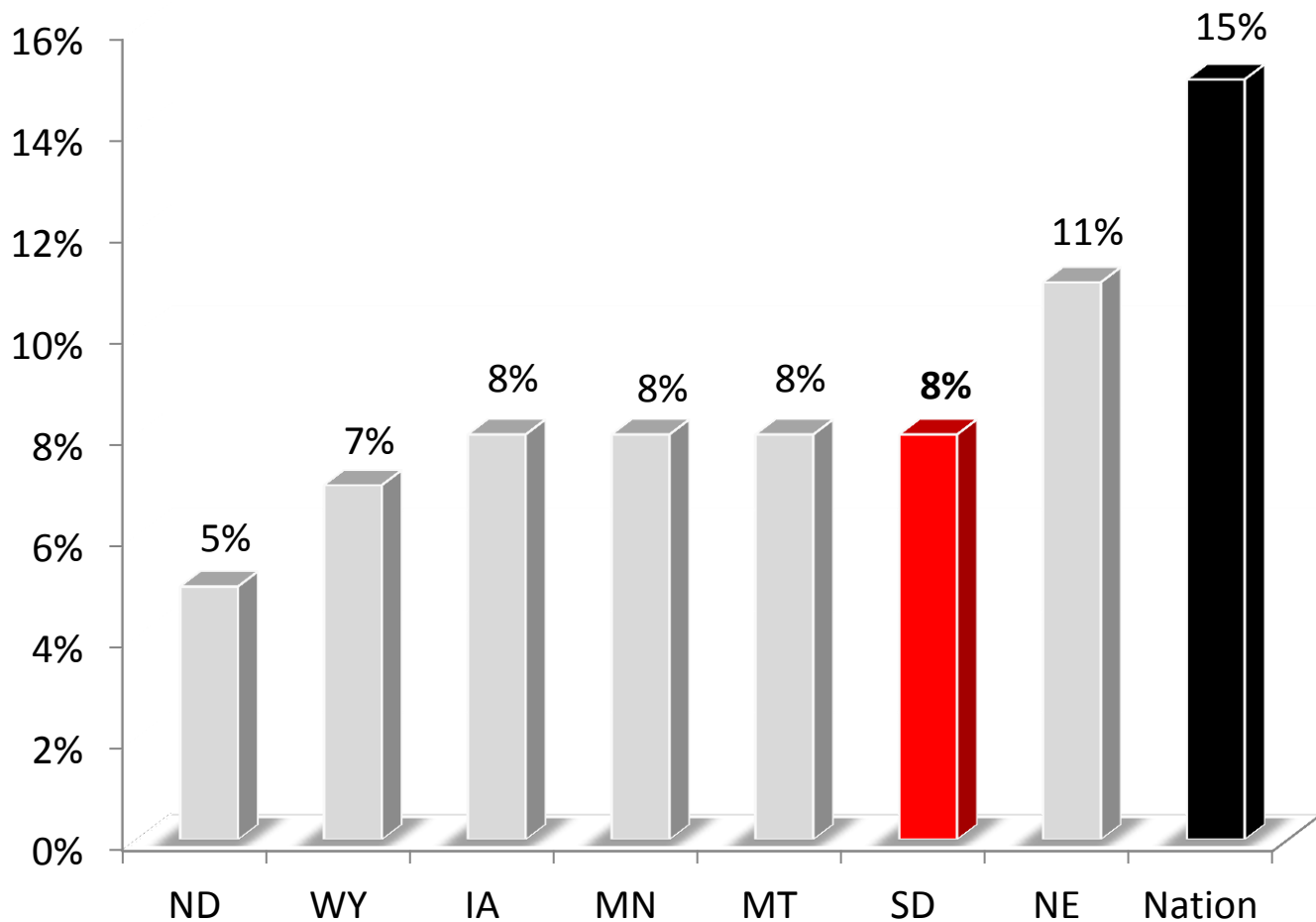

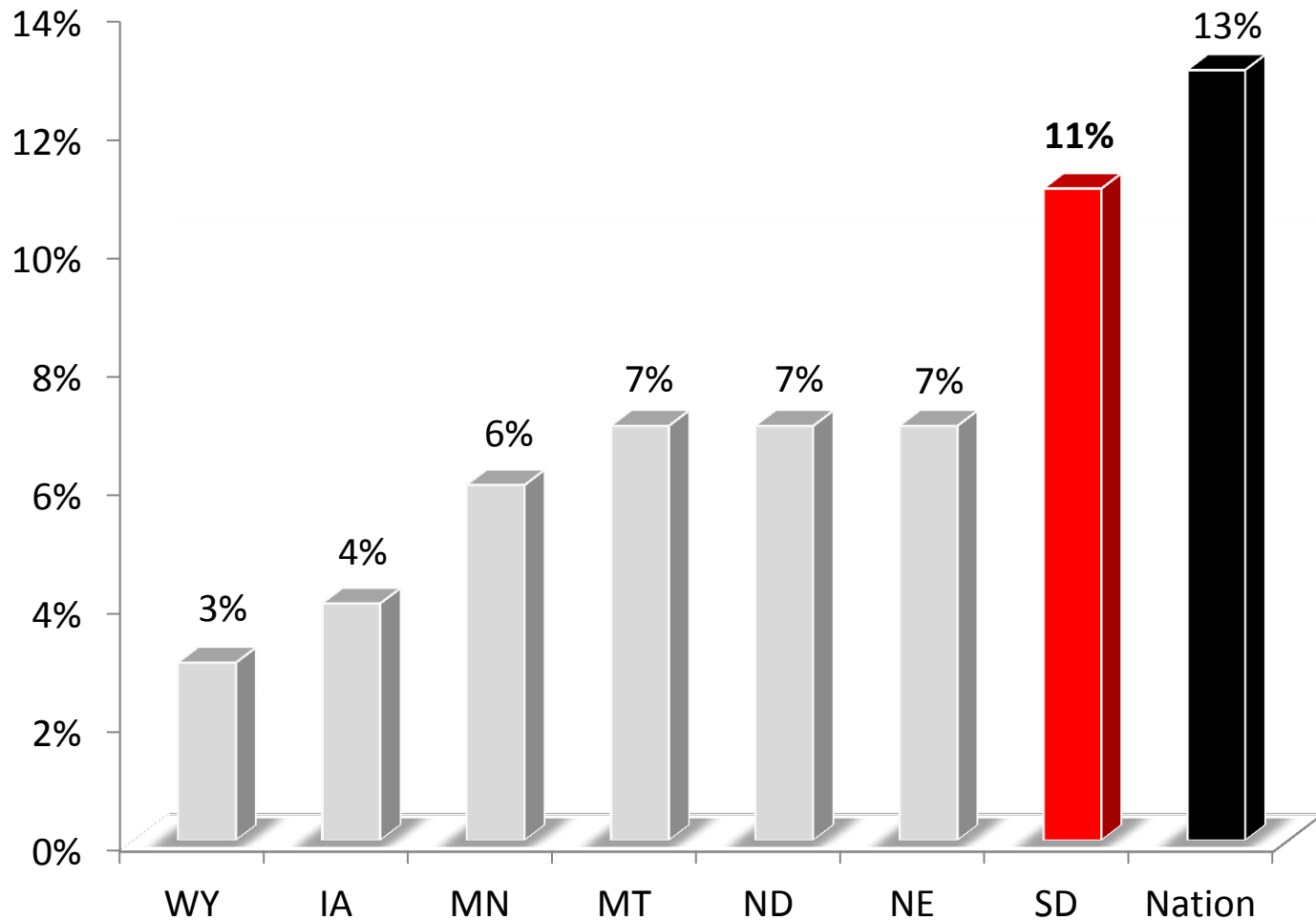
**South Dakota Compared to the Nation & Bordering States**

**household head lacks a high school diploma, 2012**

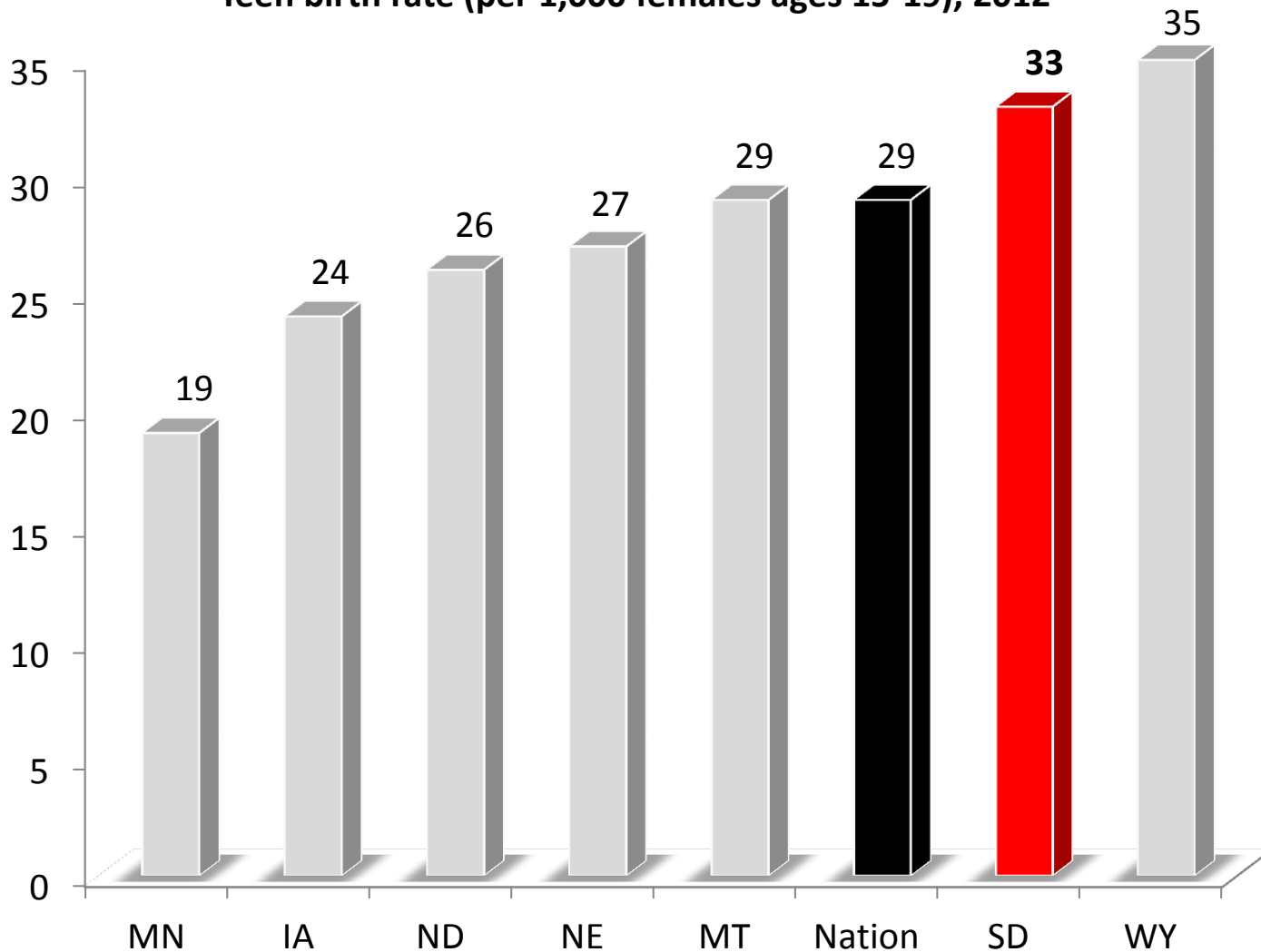


**South Dakota Compared to the Nation & Bordering States**
