PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our meeting last week was a 'Visioning' session very ably led by PP Bob Lambert and an excellent summary by the scribe PP Matt Pollard. Such a session had not been conducted for some time so it presented an ideal opportunity for club members to provide their ideas for the club's future.

Matt has provided an excellent, but lengthy, summary on the session so I will pick out the most important points.

We are a small but very active club, not only maintaining current commitments in the Avenues of Service but also developing an additional line of income for the club through gardening. Our major obstacle that can prevent further developments is our small membership. We have the talents, enthusiasm and ability to work with each other. However, our small membership indicates we need to do two things: increase our membership and to increase our collaboration with other clubs. The idea of collaboration is growing within our cluster and indeed, our district, but we ought not consider ourselves limited to geographical boundaries. We ought to seek out other clubs with similar needs, perhaps size and more importantly a similar club ethos and willingness to work with us. In this way we can engage in better and bigger activities to make a difference.

Current and emerging societal constraints on younger people have, and probably will continue to inhibit membership growth. However, other clubs are increasing their membership so what do we need to do? The simple answer is to change our mindset, methods and activities in seeking new members; we need to market our 'brand' more effectively. There are various ways of doing this but results will not come early or easily. More on this as we further digest Matt's summary of the evening and develop action items of a nature that all club members can make a positive contribution.

We have some very interesting speakers on our program and I remind members that the Cluster Meeting on 17th April at the Glenferrie RC venue, Kooyong Tennis Centre will replace our normal weekly on the 18th April. Bookings are to be done through Trybooking (see notice attached for details).

Horizon Workshop Summary by Matt Pollard

Yarra Bend members held a workshop to address the forward three-year horizon for our Club. The session was led by PP Bob Lambert. The detailed notes of the workshop will be made available to each member.

The session was highly interactive and identified a number of key strengths and a few opportunities for positive change.

In general the workshop concluded that:

• The Club is financially sound but needs to do more to attract members or it will wither. We have a strong following on Facebook and via Friends of Rotary but need to recognise that people are time poor. We need to get the message out that Rotary no longer has attendance requirements.

• Our Club is small but very active, informal with generally high member participation levels. We need to promote our projects as this is a major way for potential members to understand what we do and to get involved without a major time commitment.

• There is growing cooperative action in our local community and major projects are increasingly cooperative efforts between a number of Rotary Clubs. Notwithstanding this our Club needs to maintain its own projects in which members and friends can become involved "hands-on".

• We need to adjust the weighting of our activities to ensure the projects we have are delivering maximum benefit for the communities we serve. Visibility of our Club and its activities needs to grow to maximise potential for new member involvement.

• Processes to make guests and speakers welcome will be enhanced and meeting formats and costs will be reviewed to further enhance fellowship, learning and participation

• Our revenue sources are being diversified to reduce risk and ensure we can fund new projects and grow existing ones. Members have identified the need for new projects in our local community and in our region. These need to meet a presently unfulfilled need and provide an opportunity for hands-on input from members

• All members will be surveyed to help identify growth opportunities and ensure everyone remains engaged as our Club develops.

• Club processes and document management will be enhanced and modernised.
