Yarra Bend Rotary member – John Orr, an intrepid traveler, presented a detailed insight into his recent visit to the remote northern parts of Canada and Alaska. The trip included several flights, train travel and finally a cruise across the Pacific.

From Winnipeg in Canada, John and Lynette took a flight to the small town of Churchill in far north Manitoba and from there travelled aboard a single engine aircraft to Nanuk Lodge on the Tundra in Hudson Bay.

It's a very isolated place. No people live closer than 100 miles to Nanuk. On the flight to the Lodge, the Orr's spotted about 50 Polar Bears roaming through the environment. John said the weather is cold in the extreme and layers of clothing are needed to keep warm. He said the guides who conducted the trips out on the tundra, observe the body language of the Polar Bears to determine if it is safe to approach them and use several methods to distract the bears if they get too close.

The extensive trip across this vast and remote part of Canada was the highlight of the entire trip for John and Lynette even though they had further encounters with other bears; sighting eight Grizzlies in Denali Alaska, and two other Grizzlies at Icy Strait Point. However John said nothing compared to how close they got to see Polar bears in the wild at Nanuk.
