Bill updated the meeting on the vital statistics of Brunei on the island of Borneo. Bill spent 15 years there as a child and teenager as his father worked for Royal Dutch Shell which built and operated oil and gas facilities in the oil rich Sultanate of Brunei. It is approx. 6000 sq. km in size with a population of 400,000.

The Sultan is the second longest reigning monarch in the world. His personal wealth was estimated at \$US 20 billion in 2008. The population is predominantly Malay and Muslim. The country has great wealth from oil and gas and the citizens' benefit from cheap energy and free education and health care.

Boroondara Family Network





Guest Speaker - Dianne Sides


Dianne Sides has been working with and leading Boroondara Family Network (BFN) for 18 years. The network of volunteers with a paid coordinator provides practical advice and parenting assistance to your mothers and children up to school age within the City of Boroondara. It is a Rotary initiative first established by Rotary Club of Glenferrie and now supported also by Boroondara Cares and the City of Boroondara.

The philosophy of helping young families is designed to produce better outcomes for youth in our region. Assisting young mothers who may be disadvantaged, socially isolated or simply overwhelmed with the constant demands of child rearing is performed by 30 volunteers who have been mothers themselves and most are now also grand-mothers.

Despite the relative affluence of the general population of Boroondara, there are pockets that are in great need, financially and socially. Clients are referred to BFN by maternal and child health nurses and PANDA (Perinatal Anxiety and Depression Australia). Post-natal depression is a risk prevalent with older and "professional" mums who have no experience of babies and often have no family network of their own having moved for their careers etc.

Volunteers are screened and some training is provided such as CPR. Working with children and Police checks are required. There is sufficient demand to grow the service but the lack of longer-term funding prevents this.


