NYSF - National Youth Scientific Forum

NYSF attendees Aymeric Perfrement (Melbourne High School) and Sam Wakelam (Kew High School) both attended the Rotary sponsored National Youth Science Forum in Canberra during the recent summer break.

Aymeric opened with a summary of the Forum and how the program consists a mix of science, formal, cultural events, and social activities. He said is was truly eye-opening visiting several labs and meeting leading scientists from a range of different fields of study.

He said his particulart interest was Science Technology Engineering and Mathamatics – (STEM) and said the Forum exposed his group to cutting edge research. He also took part in a video conference with a French scientist who is working on the world's biggest particle accelerator – CERN.

Sam Wakelam said there were many highlights too for him at the NYSF and one of them was meeting Brian Schmidt – a Nobel Prize winner for physics 2011 and Vice-Chancellor ANU.

Sam agreed that NYSF had given him a new and favourable view on environmental science. He was not interested at first, thinking they were all 'crazy greenies' but on deeper investigation he changed his view.

Both Sam and Aymeric declared the experience to be mind-broadening and life changing.

Aymeric's sister, Annaliese, a former NYSF attendee was present at the meeting and was invited to update us on her activities. She has two year to go to complete her BSc majoring in maths and Chinese (mandarin). She intends to progress to a master's degree but has not made any firm decisions on topics. Recently she visited France, Russia and China.
