How the Mediterranean Sea was formed

Bob spoke about the history of the Mediterranean Sea from a presentation he attended aboard a ship cruise earlier this year. The formation of the Mediterranean Sea is traced back to the separation

of the super continents Laurasia and Gondwana that occurred millions of years ago. Geological evidence indicates that around 5.9 million years ago, the Mediterranean was cut off from the Atlantic Ocean and was partly or completely dried out over a period of some 600,000 years during the Messinian salinity crisis, before being refilled by the Zanclean flood about 5.3 million years ago when it opened up to the Atlantic Ocean off Gibraltar. Sea water poured through the gap and took an estimated two years to fill the Mediterranean basin.

Poliomyelitis (polio) is a paralysing and potentially fatal disease that still threatens children in some parts of the world. The poliovirus invades the nervous system and can cause total paralysis in a matter of hours. It can strike at any age but mainly affects children under five.

The last reported case of polio in Australia was in 1972, but according to Suzie the fight to eliminate the disease in never ending and for us it's potentially - just merely an aircraft arrival away from once again occurring in

Australia. She says in 2018 there have been only 19 cases of polio across the 3 countries that still report polio cases: Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria. The disease has almost been eradicated thanks to the extraordinary efforts of Rotary clubs around the world that began this enormous health project in 1985 when Rotary launched its Polio Plus program, the first initiative to tackle global polio eradication through the mass vaccination of children. Rotary has contributed more than \$1.6 billion to immunize more than 2.5 billion children in 122 countries.

Every dollar Rotary commits to polio eradication is matched two-to-one by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. These funds provide operational support, medical personnel, educational materials for health workers and parents. Rotary clubs donate funds and many members work side-by-side with health workers transporting the vaccine, and provide other logistical support to vaccinate children in polio-affected countries.
