## Guest Speaker - Neville John Rotary Membership Month - August

Former District Governor and current leader of the District Membership Team, Neville John was guest speaker this week and spoke in detail about the perennial task of attracting and retaining members of Rotary.



Neville said the truth is that Rotary Australia membership is currently in a decline phase with District 9800 alone losing members in the past two years. With its total number now standing at about 2400. But he said the trend can be reversed. "There is no number one 'silver bullet' that will suddenly fix membership challenges for clubs, according to Neville. However clubs can build their membership if they approach it with a strategic plan based around community needs, self-fulfillment for members.

Neville believes that good projects make for more vibrant clubs and in turn become more attractive to potential members. But this can only come about when clubs are fully engaged and listen to the communities they serve.

He said that clubs need to develop projects that reflect the humanitarian concerns that are important to local communities; e.g. homelessness, family violence and a range of many other issues.

Coordination with the Rotary community is also important. Neville said there are several initiatives that Clusters like Riverside could apply to coordinate membership efforts. Retaining Rotary members is challenge for all Clubs and a new District initiative named the 'Collective' may go some way to keeping members active and interested in projects of their particular interest. The Collective is a data base in which all clubs provide information about their projects and the system can then match individual Rotary members to projects or issues of their choice. Neville said this will help build member commitment and make clubs more vibrant.

Rotary can and does make a difference in many lives. Neville said it's quite apparent that the wider community does not fully understand the work of Rotary or the enormous benefit it gives to local communities and international humanitarian causes. "We need to share and market our great Rotary stories with the wider community, our key stakeholders and potential new members.
