
Volunteer Fair

Guest Speaker – Matt Pollard

Highlights of a Half Lap





Matt and Dianne Pollard recently completed a two and a half month caravan trip to central Australia, Darwin, then through the Kimberley and down the Western Australia coast. The final leg was across the Nullarbor. The Pollards drove their Toyota Land Cruiser and off-road caravan from Melbourne on a journey that covered some sixteen thousand kilometers across 4 states.



The trip took the Pollards along the famous Gibb River Road out of Kununurra along a long stretch of more than 600 kilometers of dirt track.

It was along this route that the road destroyed a caravan tyre. Matt says the only option was to return some 170 kilometers back along the road to buy a replacement. It's indicative of just how remote this part of Australia is from service townships. Matt says it's best to do the Gibb River road now because it is planned to eventually seal it which means there'll be a lot of traffic traversing this challenging part of the Kimberley.

Matt said trip highlights included the wonderful gorges that dot the Kimberley - a welcome and cool relief from the long dusty stretches of the Gibb River road. Lake Argyle is big and this vast stretch of water is the same size as Switzerland. Further highlights of the tour included visits to Coral Bay, Kalbari Nature Park and the head of the Great Australian Bight; home to some eighty whales.

In summary Matt said two and a half months is a bit rushed to do this trip, but do the Gibb River Road – before it is sealed.

Members of Clubs that currently use ClubRunner can continue to use their Club website login.




Members from other Clubs can obtain a Login Name and password by following the instructions by clicking after clicking on the Member Login button. You will need to use the same email recorded by Rotary International.
