Information Pack for 2024 – 2025

THEME - 'Wonderful Water'

The 'Rebuilding' Theme can be interpreted as broadly as the Young Artist wishes and does not need to conform to the dictionary definition of the word.

Introduction

The Young Artist Competition is a competition organised and promoted by Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland (Rotary GBI). There are 3 stages to the national competition, each designed to support and encourage the development of artistic skills.

Aims and Objectives

The competition aims to encourage young people to:

- be creative
- develop skills in using traditional or contemporary media
- demonstrate interpretation of the topic
- express personal ideas through a selected medium or multi-medium

Who can take part?

The competition is open to all schools and colleges and those home-educated, along with community organisations such as, Scout Groups, Girl Guides, Sea and Air Cadets) and individuals across the Thurrock Borough. There are three age groups:

Junior: 7 to 10 years old Intermediate: 11 to 13 years old Senior: 14 to 17 years old

Entrants must not be over/under the upper age parameter for each group on 31 August 2024.

With the age qualifying date of 31st August 2024, it should be noted that some junior entrants may be 11, intermediate entrants may be 14 and some senior entrants may be 18 at the time of some or all the stage competitions. For example, a competitor who may be 17 on 31st August but turns 18 on 1st September is allowed to enter. **Competitors must include their age on the application form.**

Competitors, schools, colleges, and organisations may participate in a competition held in a Rotary club outside the Borough of Thurrock but may compete in only one Rotary club or Rotary district event.



The Three Stages of the Competition

Local Thurrock Borough Heat

This is organised by the 'Rotary Club of Grays Thurrock'. The winners of each age group are entered into the 1240 Rotary District competition. Entrants need to complete <u>one</u> of the attached entry forms and submit it along with their original artwork, to the event organiser, Corin Whymark, by Thursday 13th February 2025. (Further details below)

District 1240 Competition

This is organised by Rotary during March 2025. The winners of each age group are entered into the national final.

National Final

This is organised by Rotary Great Britain & Ireland during May 2025.

Competition Guidelines

Task

To produce one finished 2-dimensional piece of artwork, up to a maximum size of A2, unframed, based upon the theme, 'Wonderful Water''. We welcome artwork in various mediums, such as: pen & ink, paint, collage, print making, etc.

To accompany the submission, each entrant **must provide** a brief sentence describing the relationship of the artwork to the theme in the space on entry form below. Failure to so will mean the entrant will be disqualified.

Pieces of artwork that are part of a current exam portfolio are not eligible for the competition, this is due to educational exam board regulations.

Artwork **will not** be returned unless specifically requested. A stamped addressed envelope needs to be provided with the artwork to facilitate returns. Winning entries may be retained for display.

Plagiarism or Close Copied Images

Plagiarised or 'close-copied' images are not permitted in any competition. It is important that we protect the work of creative individuals. Whilst we are all inspired by the work of others, there is without doubt a grey area where inspiration carries over to close copying. For our competitions 'close copying' is where, to a reasonable person, the submitted entry appears remarkably similar in significant important respects to a body of work created elsewhere. We are looking for original pieces, not copies, which match the theme of the competition.

Judges

Persons with appropriate skills, appointed by Rotary, will apply the judging criteria below.

Judging Criteria

Judges will consider technical merit; content and composition; imagination and style.

Only in exceptional circumstances, and at the sole discretion of the competition organiser, will correspondence or discussion be entered into following the competition.



Prizes

At all stages of the competition, competitors will receive a certificate of participation.

The winners of each category of the Thurrock event will receive a trophy along with a £30 Amazon voucher.

Prizes of £150 for the winner of each of the age groups for the National Final are kindly supplied by artist Lucy Pittaway and the Fine Art Trade Guild. The 3 winners will together, also have the opportunity to have a one-hour online meeting with Lucy, and fellow member of the Fine Art Group of the Guild and artist, Caroline Evans.

How to enter

To enter the local Thurrock Borough heat please post or deliver (by prior arrangement via the email below) your artwork and completed entry form(s), along with a stamp addressed envelope (if appropriate) to: "Thurrock Rotary Young Artist Competition, c/o 17 Victoria Avenue, Grays, Essex RM16 2RL". All entries must be received by Thursday 13th February 2025.

Working with Children

Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland has adopted this statement of policy in working with children, vulnerable adults and those with disability:

The needs and rights of the child, the elderly, the vulnerable and those with disability take priority. It is the duty of every Rotarian to safeguard to the best of their ability, the welfare of and prevent the physical, sexual or emotional abuse and neglect of all children, the elderly, persons with disability or otherwise vulnerable persons with whom they come into contact during their Rotarian duties.



Privacy Notice – Youth Competitions

[For the purpose of this privacy notice, Rotary International in Great Britain & Ireland (RIBI) also includes Rotary clubs and districts and their members. The use of the term 'you', 'your' also means that of your child where the competition Entrant is a minor, i.e. under the age of 18 years].

Members of Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland ("we") value the trust you put in us to process your personal information and will always be open and honest about the information we collect and how we will use it. We will never do anything with your personal information that you wouldn't reasonably expect us to in relation to the Youth Competitions and we will always make every effort to protect your privacy.

The RIBI Privacy Notice is available on rotarygbi.org and explains how we collect, process and share personal information. This 'Privacy Notice – Youth Competitions' is supplementary to the general RIBI Privacy Notice and explains in more detail how you can expect your personal information to be specifically used in relation to the Youth Competition events.

How we use your personal information for Youth Competitions

- 1. We are collecting your personal information (and that of your child if a minor) for the organisation and administration of the youth competitions only, it will not be used for any other purpose.
- 2. Club, District or Rotary Public Relations Officers may use your personal information to make contact with you to discuss public relation opportunities and will gain your specific consent at that time for the use of your information, such as photographs/interviews for newspaper articles, club or district websites etc. Where the entrant is a minor only the parent/guardian will be contacted.

Providing your personal information to others for Youth Competitions

- 3. The personal information will only be shared with others that require it for their role/the services they provide for the organisation and administration of the youth competition events. Initially, this will be at club level competitions but should an entrant progress to district or national levels of the competition, the information will also be shared with those relevant organisers.
- 4. Depending on the Youth Competition, it may be necessary to share some of your information with third parties such as providers of venue hire and catering services. Under such circumstances only the minimum amount of information for the third-party service will be provided, i.e. for caters, only the name and allergy/special dietary requirement will be disclosed, no other information.
- 5. Those individuals and organisations that have access to the personal information are also bound by the RIBI Privacy Notice.

Retaining and deleting your personal information

- 6. All reasonable steps will be taken by those concerned to ensure the personal information they have access to is kept securely and will not be shared with anyone who does not have a legitimate reason to have access to it in relation to the organisation and administration of the competitions.
- 7. For all youth competitions, personal information will be kept on file for 3 months after the date of the National Final for that specific competition. After this date, the information will be securely destroyed (either by shredding, incineration or deletion from electronic devices) at club, district and national level. This timeframe is necessary to allow for any disputes to be settled before the personal information is destroyed.
