

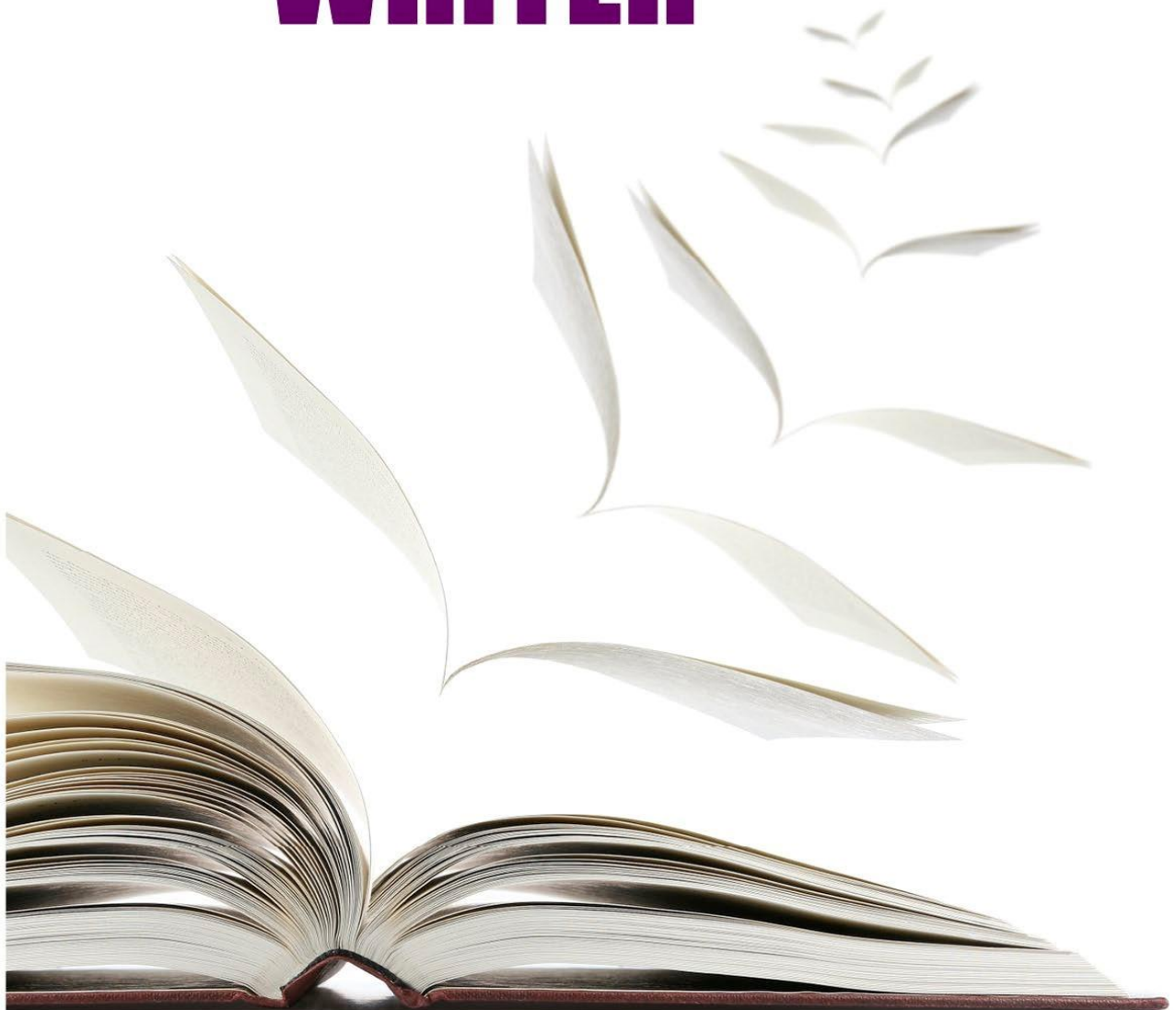

Information Pack for 2024 – 2025

THEME – 'WONDERFUL WATER'

The 'Wonderful Water' theme can be interpreted as broadly as the Young Writer wishes and does not need to conform to the dictionary definition of the word. It is intended to give young people the widest opportunity to share their creative talents in showing us what it means to them.

Introduction

This National Young Writer Competition is a well established and successful competition promoted by Rotary International in Britain and Ireland (RIBI).

Aims

This competition aims to encourage young people to:

- Be creative
- Use their writing skills
- Write with imagination and creativity

Who can take part?

The competition is open to all young people who live in Thurrock, or attend Thurrock schools and college communities, including those that are home educated or attend any young people's community organisations in Thurrock, for example, Scout Groups, Girl Guides, Sea Scouts, Air Cadets etc.

Parent/guardians can enter their own child's work.

The three age groups are:

Junior	Up to and including 10 years old
Intermediate	11 to 13 years old
Senior	14 to 17 years old

With the age qualifying date of 31st August 2024, it should be noted that some junior entrants may be 11, intermediate entrants may be 14 and some senior entrants may be 18 at the time of some or all the stage competitions i.e., a competitor may be 17 on 31st August but turns 18 on 1st September is allowed to enter.

Competitors must include their date of birth on the entry form.

For entrants with motor control difficulties, an amanuensis may be used to record the entrant's work to paper.

Please Note: Competitors, schools, colleges, and organisations can participate in a district that is outside of the Borough of Thurrock but they may compete in only one club/district competition.

The Three Stages of the Competition

Local Heats

This local heat is organised by the 'Rotary Club of Grays Thurrock'.

Entrants need to complete and attach the correct entry form to their writing and submit them to the event organiser, at youngwriter@rotaryclubofgraysthurrock.co.uk by **Thursday 13th February 2025**. The results of this local competition will be published on our website, www.graysthurrockrotary.org.uk as soon as possible after the closing date.

The winners' work from our Thurrock Borough event will be entered into the **Rotary District 1240 Competition** which is organised during March 2025. The winners of the district competition will then be entered into the **Rotary in Great Britain and Ireland National Final**. The results of this final will be available during May 2025.

Competition Guidelines

Task

To produce a written or typed story in prose entitled, '**WONDERFUL WATER**'. The written entry could be fiction or non-fiction, a story or a poem, as long as the piece relates to the theme. Entry conditions:

- Up to a **maximum of 550** words for prose entries.
- Up to a **maximum of 40 lines** for poetry entries
- **No pictures/drawings** to be part of the entry
- All entries to be legible and can be **written or typed**.
- All entries must be the **unaided work** of the young person.

Entries exceeding the above will be disqualified.

Judges

Judges with appropriate skills, appointed by Rotary, will apply the judging criteria below.

Judging Criteria

Judges will consider imagination relative to the subject; ability to engage interest and to be consistent in the power of argument. Judges will not enter into any discussion or correspondence regarding their decision. Their decision will be final and not subject to appeal.

Plagiarism or Close Copied Images

Plagiarised or 'close-copied' images are not permitted in any competition. It is important that we protect the work of creative individuals. Whilst we are all inspired by the work of others, there is without doubt a grey area where inspiration carries over to close copying. For our competitions 'close copying' is where, to a reasonable person, the submitted entry appears remarkably similar in significant important respects to a body of work created elsewhere. We are looking for unaided, original pieces, not copies, which match the theme of the competition. Competitors must not use any apps which produce any part of their submission, if detected the entry will be disqualified.

Prizes

The winners of each of the 3 stages of this competition will receive a certificate, a trophy and a £30 Amazon voucher.

Working with Children

The form below, along with their written work, is to be submitted with the entrant's full name and age category.

Rotary respects your rights and does not claim copyright for works you submit to this contest. You will retain full copyright. In addition, your moral rights are respected. You will be credited whenever your work is published by **Rotary** (and its partners). Failure to publish a credit due to error or oversight shall not be deemed a breach of this condition.

By entering this contest, you agree that any (winning or shortlisted) work submit may be used by **Rotary** (and its partners) solely for marketing and promotional purposes of this contest or future contests and for no other purpose.

These uses include:

1. Judging the competition.
2. Displaying the entries on the competition website (and websites of partners).
3. Displaying the entries at public exhibitions to promote the competition.
4. Displaying the entries in a book, magazine or similar.
5. Publishing the entries on posters to promote the competition.
6. Sub-licensing the entries to the press for reproduction in connection with the competition and any related exhibition.
7. Inclusion within any materials promoting the competition or any exhibition of works from this competition organized by Rotary.

By signing the entry form you are agreeing to grant **Rotary** a non-exclusive, irrevocable licence in each entry throughout the world in all media for the issues described above for **3** years following the date of announcement of the winners.

Privacy Notice – Youth Competitions

[For the purpose of this privacy notice, Rotary International in Great Britain & Ireland (RIBI) also includes Rotary clubs and districts and their members. The use of the term ‘you’, ‘your’ also means that of your child where the competition Entrant is a minor, i.e., under the age of 18 years].

Members of Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland (“we”) value the trust you put in us to process your personal information and will always be open and honest about the information we collect and how we will use it. We will never do anything with your personal information that you wouldn’t reasonably expect us to in relation to the Youth Competitions and we will always take every effort to protect your privacy.

The RIBI Privacy Notice is available on our website, www.rotarygbi.org, and explains how we collect, process and share personal information. This ‘Privacy Notice – Youth Competitions’ is supplementary to the general RIBI Privacy Notice and explains in more detail how you can expect your personal information to be specifically used in relation to the Youth Competition events.

How we use your personal information for Youth Competitions

1. We are collecting your personal information (and that of your child if a minor) for the organisation and administration of the youth competitions only, it will not be used for any other purpose.
2. Club, District or Rotary Public Relations Officers may use your personal information to make contact with you to discuss public relation opportunities and will gain your specific consent at that time for the use of your information, such as photographs/interviews for newspaper articles, club or district websites etc. Where the entrant is a minor only the parent/guardian will be contacted.

Providing your personal information to others for Youth Competitions

3. The personal information will only be shared with others that require it for their role/the services they provide for the organisation and administration of the youth competition events. Initially, this will be at club level competitions but should an entrant progress to district or national levels of the competition, the information will also be shared with those relevant organisers.
4. Depending on the Youth Competition, it may be necessary to share some of your information with third parties such as providers of venue hire and catering services. Under such circumstances only the minimum amount of information for the third-party service will be provided, i.e., for caterers, only the name and allergy/special dietary requirement will be disclosed, no other information.
5. Those individuals and organisations that have access to the personal information are also bound by the RIBI Privacy Notice.

Retaining and deleting your personal information

6. All reasonable steps will be taken by those concerned to ensure the personal information they have access to is kept securely and will not be shared with anyone who does not have a legitimate reason to have access to it in relation to the organisation and administration of the competitions.
7. For all youth competitions, personal information will be kept on file for 3 months after the date of the National Final for that specific competition. After this date, the information will be securely destroyed (either by shredding, incineration or deletion from electronic devices) at club, district and national level. This timeframe is necessary to allow for any disputes to be settled before the personal information is destroyed.
