30 July -

Another Saturday, another Farmers Markets and lots of happy shoppers and stall holders.

This week's team had a few changes along the way with the final team make up consisting of Sue and Paul and Jan. It was Jan's first week back after a break for health issues, so we treated her gently with half hour carpark stints and the opportunity for the occasional sit down.

The weather was pretty ordinary with the day starting at 2 degrees with fog and finishing around 4 degrees with fog. By 11am there was a light white circular object starting to appear through the fog which we assumed might be the sun, but it never appeared to confirm. Thermals and five layers did the trick and we all kept pretty warm. Car park duties were a breeze, everyone seems to be pretty well trained these days and most are willing to engage in at least a 'good morning' g'day, hi, or some other short greeting and quite a few now stopping for a chat and complimenting rotary on the job we do. At the 'front of house' stand business was as usual. Green bag sales were steady and we even sold 2 cooler bags (despite the temperature). Table hire was at a minimum with the regulars of Boxgum Grazing, Dom's Bread and Dream Cuisine being our only hirers this week, and 24 tables remaining in the storage container.

Our Hall colleagues were quite chatty, as were Adrianne and Minka, and we also had a surprise visit by our newest member Kaz, who dropped in with Bruce to check out the markets. Kaz enjoyed the shopping and the coffee and food to the extent that Bruce almost had to drag him away (see picture of Kaz with his new shopping bag (almost full of goodies) and a light snack for the trip home.

OUR HISTORY

In 1998 the Rotary Clubs of Queanbeyan and Queanbeyan West Rotary decided to sponsor a new Rotary Club based in Jerrabomberra. Bill Lilley, John Snedden and Peter Jarvis from Queanbeyan West took on the joint roll of mentoring the development of the new club. (Peter Jarvis went on to become our Charter President).

Advertising for potential members began in March 1998. After a successful campaign, the Club was chartered on 18 November 1998 with 26 members.

Initial meetings were held at the Jerrabomberra General Store—the venue was very good until we grew in numbers. We then moved to the Jerrabomberra Community Centre for a few years, and we now meet at the Jerrabomberra Public School Staff Room, on Thursdays (6.15 for 6.30 pm).

(Charter) President Peter Jarvis ran competitions to select a name for our Club Newsletter and a design for the Club banner. There were some good and some not so good suggestions. Pam Spencer suggested the winning bulletin name 'Jerraganda' and David Stevens was the successful designer of our club banner. The design incorporated a goose and the windmill associated with the original entrance to the estate adjacent to the Community Centre. Both the Jerraganda and the Club logo have evolved to keep pace with modern times.

We have always been, and continue to be, a vibrant and fun loving club providing valued community service, both locally and internationally. Our motto is,

"Doing Good and Having Fun"
