The hat competition will be judged by Cynthia Jones Bryson Milliner to former Governor General Quentin Bryce. Prize is a hat by Cynthia.


International Service Chili tendered his apology for this evening. Update Information about Noa and Emele's departure has been sent to all in an Email.
