MARKET REPORT

Note changes for Market on 23 December.

It was a beautiful sunny morning, as the JRC team arrived and got into action. Paul and Sue had visiting Rotarian David Bailey along to re-acquaint himself with the market routine, but we all got confused when David Parkinson also turned up for his rostered duty, giving us four able bodied and enthusiastic volunteers for the morning.

The morning was pretty much a standard day at CRFM, with enquiries as to where the blue berries were, and disappointed enquiries for blue berries' after 8.30am when they were all sold out. A couple of ATM seekers dropped by, and many customers were interested in when the last markets were for this year and when the markets would reopen in 2018. See below for answers. Also the Christmas craft market and Hand Made markets were on and resulted in many people parking near our market and seeking directions.

A lady's purse was handed in, and claimed by a very relieved shopper an hour later! and an old style 'flip phone' was handed in which required some detective work on David B's part (called the last number dialled and advised person answering we had the phone with that number.
