Tumanako (Means HOPE)

Tumanako Maori Culture Group was established in 2004 in Sydney as an adult entertainment group. The group performed all over NSW, VIC, QLD at weddings, 21st birthdays festivals, schools,fundraisers etc. In 2006 Isaac and his wife Trish were commissioned by the Hong Kong Tourism Board to take a team of 44 Maori performers to participate in a parade for the Chinese new years celebrations in Hong Kong.

Since 2009 Tumanako has predominantly been about the children. The group have been to many places including Perth, Kakadu NT, Sydney, NZ twice, a cruise to Noumea, Mare, Isle of Pines, Mystery Island and also performing twice on the ship.

The group consists of approximately 40-50 members.

Tamanako has achieved so much since 2009. Achievements include: Performances at a rugby league test match in Canberra between Australia and NZ; Bledisloe corporate functions in Sydney; Basketball test match between Australia and NZ; Performance at the first 4 Nations rugby union match between the All Blacks and Australia; Singing of the Australian and NZ

national anthems at countless sporting events; and also ANZAC Day ceremonies.

Isaac believes strongly that these engagements, opportunities and hands on public interaction encourages our children to become leaders in their schools and communities. Many members are representing at high levels in sport and are positive role models to their peers and the general public.

The group is currently planning a cultural schools exchange trip possibly to Hawaii later this year.

It would be remiss of me not to specially thank Chris Hunter who allowed us use of the school hall. Also big thanks to Sue and Peter J for purchasing the food and doing all the prep and cooking! Thanks to Colin for help with the trailer and cooking on the evening and of course to all our members and guests who made the kids welcome.
