#### Rotary District 9710 Annual Award for International Service goes to Jerrabomberra Rotary

At the Rotary District 9710 Changeover Lunch on Sunday 28 June, Jerra Rotary's RAWCS project in Tonga received the annual District Award for International Service. The project which started 3 years ago and will conclude later this year has involved a significant commitment by our local Rotarians together with other District Rotarians and non-Rotarian volunteers. The District Awards Committee noted that the refurbishment of the Lapaha Government Primary School in Tonga had resulted in a cleaner, more hygienic, more secure and happier environment for the school children. The school is situated in a poor area of Nuku'alofa and receives very little financial support from the Tongan Government. The project has provided clean water, improved sanitation, new toilet blocks and wash basins, and 6 refurbished

classrooms with improved lighting, new windows and security. Last September/October a team of 15

volunteers worked on site for two weeks, and this coming September another team will provide a similar hands-on contribution to further improve the school environment.

Jerra Rotary International Director 'Chilly' was on hand at the Changeover Lunch to receive the Award from outgoing District Governor Rowley. President Paul, Past President Paul, Sue R and Jan were also present the share in the experience.



#### **Rotary District Commendations for Jerrabomberra Rotarians**

At the Annual District Changeover Lunch in addition to the presentation of Awards, outgoing District Governor Rowley also recognised individuals for excellence in developing Rotary service in local, regional, national and international communities. Peter and Sue Jarvis were highly commended for contibution to Youth Service through Youth Exchange and other youth programs and Robert 'Chilly' Chilman recived a commendation for his contribution to International Service and his organisation and leading of the Tonga project which received the International Service Award. #### **OUR HISTORY**

In 1998 the Rotary Clubs of Queanbeyan and Queanbeyan West Rotary decided to sponsor a new Rotary Club based in Jerrabomberra. Bill Lilley, John Snedden and Peter Jarvis from Queanbeyan West took on the joint roll of mentoring the development of the new club. (Peter Jarvis went on to become our Charter President).

Advertising for potential members began in March 1998. After a successful campaign, the Club was chartered on 18 November 1998 with 26 members.

Initial meetings were held at the Jerrabomberra General Store—the venue was very good until we grew in numbers. We then moved to the Jerrabomberra Community Centre for a few years, and we now meet at the Jerrabomberra Public School Staff Room, on Thursdays (6.15 for 6.30 pm).

(Charter) President Peter Jarvis ran competitions to select a name for our Club Newsletter and a design for the Club banner. There were some good and some not so good suggestions. Pam Spencer suggested the winning bulletin name 'Jerraganda' and David Stevens was the successful designer of our club banner. The design incorporated a goose and the windmill associated with the original entrance to the estate adjacent to the Community Centre. Both the Jerraganda and the Club logo have evolved to keep pace with modern times.

We have always been, and continue to be, a vibrant and fun loving club providing valued community service, both locally and internationally. Our motto is,
