Jerra Rotary - Table Refurbishment




Our clubs biggest commitment is running the information booth at EPIC Farmer's Market. In addition, to customer service, we rent out tables to vendors.



Over the years, some of the tables have fallen into disrepair and were starting to fall apart. With a keen sense of duty to the market community, the market master felt obligated to fix the degraded tables.

The word was put out to assemble a working party at the Miller's place on Saturday, March 12th to investigate and rectify the problem of dysfunctional tables. The call for help was met by a handful of highly motivated members all wielding power tools and exuding enthusiasm. The process started off slowly as the team analysed the core problems then devised the best course of action.




One by one the tables were transformed from self-collapsing pieces of junk into fully functional tables for vendors to proudly display their goods. The last step in the process we called the vendor test. One of us would set up the table in a similar fashion as what the vendors do. If the legs locked and the table was sturdy, it passed. If not, then it was reworked on until it passed our rigorous operational trial. There were 11 dodgy

tables to fix and the dedicated crew was able to resurrect 10 of them saving the club hundreds of dollars in replacement cost.



The conference will commence on Thursday evening 27th October with a Civic Reception being held by the Mayor of Goulburn where all conference attendees are welcome to attend. This will be held at the Grace Millsom Centre at no cost to the attendees.

The main sessions for the conference will be held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday mornings at the Soldiers Club, a marvellous comfortable venue. There were a number of enquiries for absent stallholders, notably many for Canberra Colour whom we are informed will be no longer attending the markets. Overall the number of inside stallholders seemed to be down, although the outside spaces were largely utilized.

We did assist though with a successful lost wallet announcement and resolution of a situation where a heat distressed dog was reported as left in a car. Fortunately, Bruce sorted this situation to the relief of the dog, its owners and the two girls that reported the issue. We also received a 'complaint' about the presence of the Refugee Rally folk handing out brochures for a rally this weekend in Canberra. Apparently a complaint had also been made last week, as one of the Rally advocates mentioned this to me when she approached me to ask if they were upsetting us by using that location. From my observation, the refugee advocates were courteous and reasonably well received by market patrons entering at that point.

Remaining stocks include 3 boxes of the green bags (all of the newer deficient variety), 1 box of the red bags and two slabs of water.

I will get the takings to Carolyn on Wednesday as I will be out of town Monday-Tuesday.

OUR HISTORY

In 1998 the Rotary Clubs of Queanbeyan and Queanbeyan West Rotary decided to sponsor a new Rotary Club based in Jerrabomberra. Bill Lilley, John Snedden and Peter Jarvis from Queanbeyan West took on the joint roll of mentoring the development of the new club. (Peter Jarvis went on to become our Charter President).

Advertising for potential members began in March 1998. After a successful campaign, the Club was chartered on 18 November 1998 with 26 members.

Initial meetings were held at the Jerrabomberra General Store—the venue was very good until we grew in numbers. We then moved to the Jerrabomberra Community Centre for a few years, and we now meet at the Jerrabomberra Public School Staff Room, on Thursdays (6.15 for 6.30 pm).

(Charter) President Peter Jarvis ran competitions to select a name for our Club Newsletter and a design for the Club banner. There were some good and some not so good suggestions. Pam Spencer suggested the winning bulletin name 'Jerraganda' and David Stevens was the successful designer of our club banner. The design incorporated a goose and the windmill associated with the original entrance to the estate adjacent to the Community Centre. Both the Jerraganda and the Club logo have evolved to keep pace with modern times.

We have always been, and continue to be, a vibrant and fun loving club providing valued community service, both locally and internationally. Our motto is,

“Doing Good and Having Fun”
