Yvonne Luxford – Sergeant from the Canberra Club but more importantly Executive Officer of Aboriginal Suicide Prevention Evaluation Project

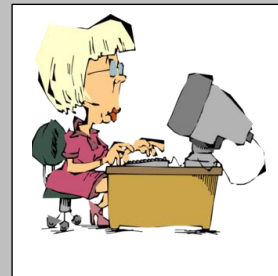
This was a fitting speaker as it was Closing The Gap Day. This day is basically about better health and education outcomes for indigenous people.

It is a campaign that has the support of the Prime Minister who hosted an event at Parliament House in the morning.

The sadness and desperation of our Aboriginal people was evidenced by the recent suicide of a 10 year old girl in Western Australia this month. Yvonne talked of her role in evaluating suicide prevention programs to see what works best. This is being lead by Aboriginal people. They are also developing Critical Response teams. The successful programs recognise the problems of racism and disengagement and they are trying to address the problem that 1 out of every 20 Aboriginal deaths are caused by suicide.

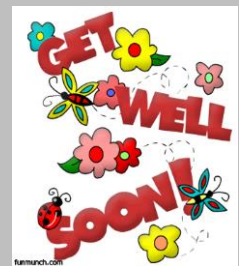
A conference will be held in Alice Springs on 5-6th May - "Getting Together For A Better Tomorrow." They are seeking sponsorship to get some people there.

Hello everyone

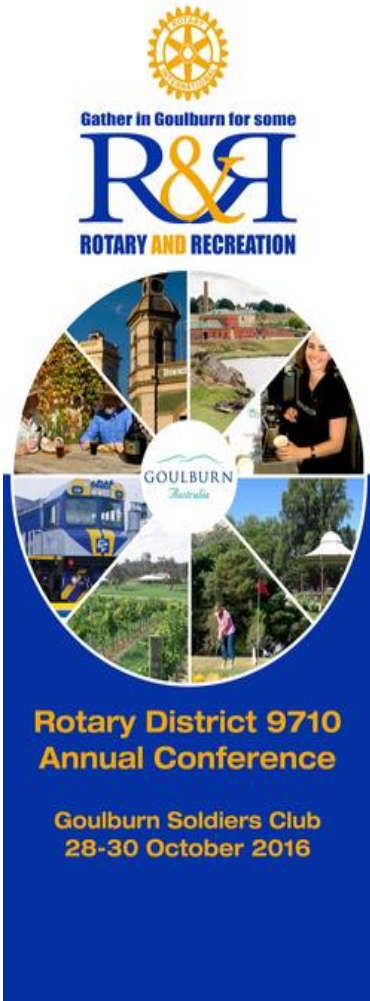

The organising committee and I invite you and your club members to Goulburn to not only hear interesting speakers but also for yourself and your partner to enjoy the sights, sounds and what Goulburn has to offer.

The conference will commence on Thursday evening 27th October with a Civic Reception being held by the Mayor of Goulburn where all conference attendees are welcome to attend. This will be held at the Grace Millsom Centre at no cost to the attendees.

The main sessions for the conference will be held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday mornings at the Soldiers Club, a marvellous comfortable venue. On Friday and Saturday afternoons the organising committee have arranged for you to select from a range of tours that you may attend or perhaps you would like to enter the golf competition that is being organised. These are not included in your registration fee for the conference but can be purchased as an add on.

Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment (RYPEN)

RYPEN is a 3 day camp and program for 14 to 17 year old boys and girls. The aim is to communicate to these young people a series of ideas, problems and social experiences which will assist them in forming their own values and moral standards, and also to broaden their horizons culturally, socially and academically.

RYPEN is an intensive program, consisting of plenary sessions, workshops, sport and entertainment activities. Participants are given the opportunity to learn from achievers in the worlds of business, sport and entertainment and presenters will talk at keynote sessions and share their experiences with participants while emphasizing the need to work hard and stay focused. At the same time participants are interacting with peers from different backgrounds and also improving their teamworking and leadership skills. This is all done in an informal atmosphere, where questions and debate are encouraged.

Nominees are accommodated in dormitory style modern rooms, and all meals are provided in a communal dining room. The District RYPEN Committee live in for the duration of the camp and provide counselling and security.

The motto for RYPEN, *'The Cultivation of Youth'*, emerged from the very first camp back in 1980.

If you think a young person has qualities worth developing then they are suitable for RYPEN and you should nominate them now.

OUR HISTORY

In 1998 the Rotary Clubs of Queanbeyan and Queanbeyan West Rotary decided to sponsor a new Rotary Club based in Jerrabomberra. Bill Lilley, John Snedden and Peter Jarvis from Queanbeyan West took on the joint roll of mentoring the development of the new club. (Peter Jarvis went on to become our Charter President).

Advertising for potential members began in March 1998. After a successful campaign, the Club was chartered on 18 November 1998 with 26 members.

Initial meetings were held at the Jerrabomberra General Store—the venue was very good until we grew in numbers. We then moved to the Jerrabomberra Community Centre for a few years, and we now meet at the Jerrabomberra Public School Staff Room, on Thursdays (6.15 for 6.30 pm).

(Charter) President Peter Jarvis ran competitions to select a name for our Club Newsletter and a design for the Club banner. There were some good and some not so good suggestions. Pam Spencer suggested the winning bulletin name 'Jerraganda' and David Stevens was the successful designer of our club banner. The design incorporated a goose and the windmill associated with the original entrance to the estate adjacent to the Community Centre. Both the Jerraganda and the Club logo have evolved to keep pace with modern times.

We have always been, and continue to be, a vibrant and fun loving club providing valued community service, both locally and internationally. Our motto is,

“Doing Good and Having Fun”
