CLUB

21st January, 1975 - Letter from Paul Bernholdt Head, Eastern Hemisphere Dept. Rotary International to Doug Biggs, President, Rotary Club of Nambour, advising that Enactment 74-50 has been approved and a second Club can be formed in the same Territory.

16th December, 1975 - Letter from District Governor Ray Sadler to Past President, Col Grimes, inviting Col to be his special representative for the New Club in Nambour.

22nd April, 1976 - A meeting of 8 prospective members was held in Col Grimes office to plan for a formation meeting and to try to recruit more members.

18th May, 1976 - A formation meeting held at the Cane Growers Hall, Lowe Street, Nambour at 7.55pm. Chairman, Col Grimes, District Governors Representative, District Governor Ray Sadler, Past District Governor Ben Bennett, Nambour Club President, Neil Garrett, Immediate Past President Doug Biggs, several members of the Nambour Rotary Club, and 18 prospective members of the new Club. Four members of the Nambour Club, Col Grimes, Murray Dickson, Brian Mallett and Max Imhoff, agreed to transfer their Rotary membership from Nambour Club to the New Club.

NAME - Three Names were suggested.

Nambour-Maroochy, Nambour-Marutchi and Nambour 76.

It was agreed we would share territory with the Nambour Club, admission fee was set at \$18, membership fee \$30 per year.

The venue to be "The Big Pineapple" meal cost \$3.50. Next meeting 5.45pm for 6pm Wednesday 26th May, 1976.

26th May, 1976 - Provisional Nambour 76 Rotary Club applied to Rotary International for membership, enclosing a list of 27 members and their particulars.

15th June, 1976 - Nambour 76 Rotary Club admitted to Rotary International

25th September, 1976 - Presentation of the Charter from Rotary International by District Governor Vic Honour.

6th October, 1976 - Don Bambling agreed to be Club Historian. District Conference held in Bundaberg with 6 members and their Rotaryannes attending.

Barn Dance at Woombye netted \$110, Car Rally to Kenilworth and B.B.Q. netted \$100, November Fair netted \$100, Greatest Show on Earth Circus in Brisbane \$60, Sundale Stampede \$102, Show Gates \$500, First Community Service project was organised by Brian Mallett to provide a fresh water supply to the Dunethin Rock Scout Centre. The Namba Nonicle project began in March, 1977, with the formation of a small Sub-committee, Ian Muller Chairman, John Jones and Des Jack. 8,000 copies were printed and sold at 30¢ each. \$577 was raised by selling the first edition. Nett profit from the first Nonicle was \$3,643.73. Assisted Nambour Club at the November Fair. Orbital - Andrew Mako died June, 1977.

2. Immediate Past President of R.I. Clem Renouf, would donate his entire salary for his year as R.I. President to the project.
3. Both Nambour Clubs would match this with a donation of \$13,000 each in due course.
4. A Company known as "The Rotary Clubs of Nambour Service Pty" would be established to manage the project.
5. The Company would have six Directors made up of three Directors nominated by each Club.

Nambour '76 subsequently nominated Col Grimes, Gordon Downing, and Ron Garrett.

1979 - 1980

Footnote - By the 6th August, 1980, the Project had become too big both physically and financially for both Rotary Clubs. On a suggestion from Sundale, an amalgamation with Sundale was effected, on condition that the same financial commitments were continued. Sundale consented to 2 Nominees from each Rotary Club to serve on their Management Committee.

Nambour 76 decided our financial commitment would capitalize over the next 3 Rotary years to enable at least some financial support to other deserving charities.
